R. Manning, her Britannick Majesty's Secretary to this Republick, arrived here on the first Instant. The next Day he notified his Arrival to the Congress or Heads of the three Leagues of the Grifons affembled here, and to the Magistracy of this City. The Day after he received folemn Deputations from them both, to Compliment him upon that Occasion. On the 5th Instant in the Morning he had Audience of the Congress, to which he was Conducted by several Deputies of the State, and a confiderable Number of the Principal Persons of the Town. After a short Speech, according to Custom, Her Majesty's Minister presented to the Affembly a Memorial, containing the principal Points of his Commission; which done, the President of the Congress made him a very obliging Answer on the part of the Republick, in Terms tull of the most humble Acknowledgements, for the great Honour Her Majesty had done their State, in fending a Minister to refide among taem, with great Expressions of Zeal and Respect for Her Majesty's Person, and of Civility to Her Minister. The Ceremony of the Audience being over, he was reconducted to his House by the Deputies of the State, and accompanied as before by several Persons of the greatest Distinction in this City.

Berne, December 14. N. S. The Governor of Rhin-felden, one of the Forest Towns, being alarmed at the great number of French Troops that are quartered in Alfatia, and being apprehensive the Enemy may have some Design upon those Towns, has writ to these Cantons to acquaint them with his Fears, and to know at the same time, if they would continue to take those Towns under their Protection, as they have done during this War; upon which this Canton took that Matter fome Days ago into Consideration, and resolved, for themselves, not only to continue their Protection to them in the same manner they have done hitherto, but have likewise writ to the other Protestant Cantons to join with them in that Resolution; to which, in all probability, they will conform themselves. This Proof of their Zeal for the common Cause is the more remarkable, because they highly incense the French Court by this Proeeeding; and know they are to meet with Oppolition from other Potentates, who favour the Roman Catholicks

in the Business of Tockenbourg.

Turin, December 22. N. S. His Royal Highness is returned here from the Venerie, and designs to pass the Winter in this City. We hope that the Disterences between his Imperial Majesty and this Court will be special dily accommodated, the Marquis de Graneri, who was deputed by his Royal Highness to treat with the Bishop of the five Churches, is returned to Milan. The new Levies are carried on with great Success, throughout all his Royal Highness's Deminions; and we hear that there will be a confiderable Augmentation of every Battalion for the Service of the enfuing Campaign. Monfieur Ratto is fent into Germany to buy Horses to remount our Cavalry, as well as for the Transportation of the Arallery Several Merchants have already lent confiderable Sums of Mony on the Revenues of his Royal Highness; and certain Commissaries have undertaken to furnish the Army with fineen handred thousand Pound of Powder, and a

fufficient quantity of Bullets, Bombs, and Granadoes, by the third of April. We hear that Count Masse, the Duke of Savoy's Minister at the Hague, will succeed the late Count Briancon, as his Roya! Highness's Minister to the Court of Great Britain. We are advised from Genoa, that on the 4th Instant Sir Edward Whitaker failed from Leghorn for Port-Mahon, with the Squadron under his Command; that Prince Maurice of Savoy arrived at Genoa, in order to go to Barcelona in the fame English Man of War which brought Lieurenant-General Stanhope from thence; and that great Sums of Mony are to be transmitted in that Vessel, for the Service of his Catho-

lick Majetty in Spain. Venice, December 27. N. S. The French Amhassa-dor hath lately received several Expresses from the Court of France, and about a Forenight fince that Minister delivered a Memorial to the Senate, wherein he fets forth what Honour the King his Master had done the Republick of Venice, by electing one of her Subjects Protector of the Crown of France; but that fince his Wejefty found they received his Favours with fo little Respect, he pretended his Majesty had fent him Instructions forthwith to return home, and defigned to entertain no further Commerce or Negotiations with this State. His Excellency is accordingly preparing for his Departure, and deligns to fet out for France the beginning of the next Month, unless he does, in the mean time, receive contrary Instructions from the French Court; he hath already fent fome of his Equipage to Leghorn, and intends to travel with the rest through the Republick of the Grisons. Republick hath dispatched a Courier to Paris, in order to accommodate these Differences; and they hope to prevail on Monsieur de Pomponeto stay here 'till the Return of that Courier. Advices from Naples inform us, that the Encmy had formed a Defign to furprize Orbitello; but Cardinal Grimani had fent fuch timely Succours for the Security of that Place, that they had entirely quitted their Enterprize. The Viceroy hath also commanded confiderable Bodies of Troops to march to Reggio, and hath made feveral Alterations in the Ministry of that Kingdom. The last Advices from Rome say, that the Pope was relapsed into his former Indisposition, and that his Physicians were apprehensive or his Death. It was also reported, that Monsieur Albani would forthwich return from Vienna en this Occasion, but it is more generally believed that Minister will hasten his Return from the Imperial Court, by reason the Emperor doth not enter to readily into the Nego iation with him as was expected, in order to remove the Misunderstandings between the Pope and his Imperial Majesty. These Advices add, that on the 8th Instant the Coronation of his Holiness was celebrated with great Solemnity, that being the tenth Year from the time that the present Pope was preserred to the Pontifical Chair: Oa that Day his Holinels disposed of divers vacant Benefices, and several Civil Employments. Monsignior Marino, a Genoese, was made Master of the southold, and Monfignior Gerani succeeded him as Auditor General of the Apollolical Chamber. Moefignior l'iazza, who hath his therto been without any Chargeter at Vienna, was declared Nuncio to that Court. Monfignior Bichi, who is now in Swifferland, is appointed Nuncio to the King of Portugal, and Monfignior Ca-acciolito the Swifs Cantons. An Abby was also given at that time to the Abbie Soirlatti, Minister from the late Elector of Bayarla, and another to the Abbot Canoni, who is now at the Higue. These Advices add, that the Differences between the Courteof Rome and Maerid were encreased every Doy; and that Monfignior Lucini, a Nespolitan, was appointed to be Kuncio to his Catholick Majefiy. The Marquis de Prié had received his Credentials from Vienna, as Imperial Ambassador, but had not yet delivered them to the Mini-sters of the Court of Rome.
