

Plymouth, January 3. Yesterday sailed her Majesty's Ships the *St. Albans* and *Hind* to Cruize; and were this Day followed by the Lord *Durley* in the *Monk*, together with the *Romney*, *Winchester*, *August* and *Medway*. This Evening came in the *Restoration* and *Plymouth*, with a French Privateer of twenty Guns; they were separated from the rest of the Squadron on the 27th past by bad Weather.

Dartmouth, January 3. This Day came into this Port the *Peterborough-Galley* of *Bristol*, Capt. *Samuel Jacob* Commander, for London, who discharged his Cargo, taken in at *Newfoundland*, at *Barcelona*, reloaded Wines at *Saloe*, and came from thence the sixth of December, and stopped at *Majorca* the seventh, where he found the *Tinpot* and *Dolphin*, two Dutch Privateers, who had taken and brought in with them, as Prize, after a hot Dispute, the *Foy-Pink* of thirty three Guns, and four hundred and odd Men, a French Privateer, but formerly an English Man of War, taken in the Streights by the French.

Bristol, January 3. This Day came in the *Betty Galley* of this Place, *Joseph Osbar* Commander, in three Weeks from *Gibraltar*, laden with Wine and Fruit, which he took in at *Barcelona*. He left several *Bristol Gallies* at *Gibraltar* that came from *Newfoundland*, and bound up the Streights. Her Majesty's Ship the *Hastings* is still in Kingroad with several outward-bound Merchant-men.

Cowes, January 4. Here is arrived the *Bartholomew Galley* of and for London, *Bartholomew Jones* Master, from *Barcelona*.

Portsmouth, January 5. Sir *John Norris* continues still in this Port, with her Majesty's Squadron and the Outward-bound Fleet of Merchantmen.

Deale, January 5. Her Majesty's Ship the *Strombulo*, Cruising Yesterday to the Westward, brought in hither last Night as Prize a French Snow, with thirty three Men, and four Guns, taken off of *Dungeness*; and last Night came in hither the *Godfrey Galley* from *Leghorne*.
