The Deputy Lieutenants (Reallocation) (No. 2) Order 1974

Made 19th September 1974

Coming into Operation 10th October 1974

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 218 of the Local Government Act 1972(a) and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf I hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Deputy Lieutenants (Reallocation) (No. 2) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on the 10th October 1974 and shall have effect as from the 1st April 1974.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. In this Order unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions "Deputy Lieutenant", "new County" and "office" shall have the same meaning as in the Local Government Act 1972.

4. As from 1st April 1974 each of the persons specified in column 1 of the Schedule of this Order, being a person who immediately before 1st April 1974 was holding office as a Deputy Lieutenant, shall continue on and after that date to hold office as a Deputy Lieutenant in the new County specified in column 2 of the said Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

Section 218 (5) of the Local Government Act 1972 provides that any Deputy Lieutenant holding office immediately before 1st April 1974 outside Greater London shall continue to hold office on and after that date as Deputy Lieutenant of the new County in which he resides or such other new County as may be specified in an Order made by the Secretary of State. The Order herein specifies Deputy Lieutenants whose continuation in office shall be exercised with effect from the 1st April 1974 in relation to a new County and as specified in the Order.
