THE French Ambassador hath left his own House, and bath at present an Apartment in that of Baron Widmar (who was formerly the Duke of Bavaria's Envoyat the Court of England) with a defign to fet out for France within few Days, by the way of Swifferland and the Country of the Grifons. An English Merchan-man, alled the Brice Galley, is arrived here from Great Britain. Our lift Advices from Rome fay, the Pope's Indisposition was so great, that he omitted all the usual Functions at the Feast of the Navivity. A Courier lately arrived at that Coun, with Instructions to Monsieur Molines to Sollicit for the Pope's Grant of the Archbishoprick of Teledo. and other Benefices that were vacant in the Kingdom of Spain. It is faid, Prince Avellino was speedily expected from Barcelona, with the Character of Ambassador from his Catholick Majesty to his Holiness. They write from Naples, that Cardinal Grimani had lately made several Alterations in the Ministry of that Kingdom; that divers rich Prizes had been taken from the Enemy on the Coast of Cabria, and brought into Reggio; that the French Troops in Sicily were preparing to quit that Island, and that General Mahoni and most of the principal Officers were already sailed from thence.

Vinna, January 4. N. S. This Court appears very well faisfied with the Measures which have been taken by the High Allies to carry on the War, and are resolved to exright Allies to carry on the war, and are resolved to exect their utmost Power to oblige the French King to grant such Terms as may effectually tend to the Security of the Empire, and the Tranquilley of Europe. Prince Eugene hath summoned all the Principal Officers of the Imperial Armies to affift at a General Council of War. Count Merci is arrived here from the Upper Rhine, and General Heister is returned from Hungary. The Emperer hath prolonged the Term within which the Hunguian Malecontents are to return to their Allegiance, and to receive the Benefit of his late gracious Declaration of Pardon; and also ordered the Articles which the lift Diet of Presburg had resolved to grant the States of Hungary to be made publick. The Stoftance of which is, That the States of Hungary shall baye the Liverty to proted to the Election of a new King. if the Line-Male or the late Emperor Leopold shall happen to be extinct. That the Hungarian Nation shall be entirely governed by their own Laws. That no Gentleman or Burgher of Hungary hall be Arrested before a due Citation, uniess in Cases of high-Treason; on Conviction of which Crime their Goods shall be confiscated. That a General Diet shall be Assembled every three Years. That the Treasury of Hungry shall be dependant on that of Vienna, for the better administration of the publick Revenue; and therefore be to ways Regulated by the general Dier. That the Emptrer shall have the disposal of all Ecclesiatical Preferments. That the Affairs of Religion shall be established ca the Resolutions of the Diets of Presburg and Ardemburg. That an Hungarian Counsellor may be elected at the first Diet, who is to have the Charge of the Execution of the Laws. That it Prince Ragotzi and his Adherents do not make their Submission to his Imperial Maisburnities and the Charge of the Laws. ely within the last Term granted for their Pardon, they hall be declared Traitors and Enemies to their Coun'ry, andtheir Goods shall be Confiscated for the Service of the Publick. His Imperial Majesty surther promises to restore the Lands taken from the Turks to the law'ul Proprietors, if they can prove their Title. It is uncertain whe-

The Deputies of the States took a Journey to Ghent on that Occasion, and were received with great Demonstrations of Joy by the principal Inhabitants, and some established Communities of that City. This Act declares, That notwithstanding the Surprize of Ghent and taking of Bruges were very prejudicial to his Catholick Majesty's Service, and the Common Cause; yet to give them an Instance of his Ciemency and mild Government, his Majesty had, by the Advice of his Council, granted them a General Perdon. had enlarged fuch as were imprisoned on Suspicion of being Accomplices in that Action, restored them to their former Privileges and Honours, and strictly required that they should not be prosecuted, or any ways reproached for any thing that was transacted in that Affair. Letters from Compeigne fay, that notwithstanding the Sollicitations of Count Bergeick for Mony at the Court of France for the Payment of the Spanish and Walloon Troops in Flanders ever since the taking of Mons, and the frequent Promises they have obtained, that the Arrears due to those Forces should be discharged the beginning of this Month, they had yet received none of their Pay. Advices from Paris fay, that the Duke of Burgundy had expreffed a Defire to command the Army in Flanders the next Campaign; but the King had not yet determined that Affair.
