THE Magistrates have lately been employed in finding out proper Methods for preventing such Dif-orders as have been lately committed in this City: Among other Crimes, even Murthers have been fo frequent, that Men have not been fafe in their very Houfes; which is attributed to the great Lenity of the Government in punishing this Offence, no Criminal having been Executed for it within five Years last past, until Yesterday, at which time one only was hanged; but several others are to die to Morrow in the same manner. The last Vessels which came from Morea give a lamentable Account of the great Devastation which the Plague makes near Salona; and fuch of the Natives as are arrived here from those Parts, have been constrained to List themselves in the Service of this State, in order to prevent any others from flying hither. The Magistrates, whose peculiar Office it is to have a regard to all things that may concern the Health of the Citizens, have approved that Method of disposing of such as repair to this City from insected Places; and have Published an Order, that all Vessels from the Morea shall for the future perform a Quarantain. The Duke of Modena hath represented to the Emperor, that he is unable to entertain within his Dutchy the General Officers, and others belonging to the Imperial Train Advices from Rome fay, that it was feared the Pope's Indisposition would end in a Dropsie; that the Cardinal Albani designed to continue 'till next Easter in Foreign Courts. The Abbot Lucini is set out for Barcelona, with the Character of Internuncio to the King of These Advices add, that a Congregation of Cardinals had been lately held there, to find out Means for furnishing the Emperor with a hundred thousand Growns, in order to hasten the Evacuation of Commachio. It is faid the Marquis de Prié hath received his Credentials from his Imperial Majesty, for acting as his Ambassador to the Pope. There is no certain Account when Prince Avellino is expected at Rome, as Ambassador Extraordinary for the Acknowledgment of his Catholick Majesty's Obedience to that See. They write from Naples, that an Edick is there Published, to signify that the Sequestration of the Ecclesiastical Benefices is revoked. On the 3d Infant fifteen Transport Ships, part of which are Eritish, and part Dutch, arrived there, to take in Corn for Barcelona; two other English Ships, which were configned to the Conful of that Nation, came in at the fame time. We hear from Reggio, that General Caraffa had pet in there with five Vessels, among which was a French Ship of thirty Guns, that had been taken a few Days before.

Milan, January 18. N. S. Count Thaun continues here, and it is believed he hath altered his Resolution of taking a Journey to Vienna, and will return to Piedmont the latter end of the next Month, in order to forward the Preparations for the ensuing Campaign, and to make the necessary Dispositions for being early in the Field. Advices from Leghorn fay, that five English and fix Durch Men of War came in there on the 12th Instant with three French Corn Ships, being part of the Fleet that was bound to Marseilles from the Levant. The Contederate Squadron being obliged to separate by bad Weather, the Enemy escaped them; but some Engl sh and Dutch Capers had taken sour other Prizes or a considerable value, and more also and were also arrived with them at that Port.

Borlin, January 24. N. S. The Recruits for the Pruffan Troops in the Service of the Alies are raising with

very good Success throughout his Majesty's Dominions, and it is faid that this Court will not only permit those that are in the Service of the Duke of Savoy to continue in Italy; but also augment their Forces in the Netherlands with feveral thousand Men, and contribute their utmost Endeavours for the more effectual Profecution of the War. His Prussian Majesty hath ordered his Minifter at Vienna to reprefent to that Court the Grievances of the Protestants in Silesia, and to infilt on the strict Observation of the Treaty concluded at Alt-Ranslat between the Emperor and the King of Sweden, in Favour of all the Inhabitants of that Country who are of the Protestant Religion. Letters from Mittru of the 16th Instant bring us an Account of a dreadful Accident which befell the City of Riga; a Magazine of eight hundred Barrels or Powder, which was laid up in a Laboratory on one of the Bastions of the Citadel, being blown up by chance, had buried above two thouland Men in its Ruins: The Bassion and an adjoining Fospital were entirely demolished by this Disaster, which struck such a Consternation into the Garrison, that at first they believed it was done by Treachery, and that the Enemy was at their Gates. But they foon after recovered from their Surprize, and applied themselves to repair the Breach with fuch Materials as they could get, and are making three Rows of Pali's loes for their greater Security. The Besieged are very much dejected at this Missortune, and it is thought that it will facilitate the Success of the Enterprize of his Czarish Majesty on that City. Advices from Moscow fay, that the Ruffian Ambaffador at Confirminople had fignified to the Czar, that all Misunderstandings between his Czarifh Majesty and the Grand Signior were entirely removed, and that the Ottoman Port had no Defign in view of engaging in a War with Muscovy; but were fo far alarmed with the late Euccesses of the Muscovites, that they were induced to reinforce the Garrisons on the Frontiers, and take other Precautions for their own Security; but that they were ready to prolong the Truce between the two Empires, and enter into fuch Engagements as should be thought requisite not to affist the King of Sweden against Muscovy, notwithstanding any Instauces that may be made by the Minist r of that Prince in favour of his Master.

Bruffels, fanuary 30. N. S. Monsieur Brockhoven, Brother of Count Bergeick (who was left as Hostage at Mons for the Payment of the Debts of the French Officers) having obtained leave to confer with the Count at Namur. passed through this City on the 28th Instant, en his Journey to that Place. A Deputation of the States of Hainault is come hither with the Presentation of the Subfidy lately granted by that Province for the Service of his Catholick Majesty, and the Council of State is preparing an Instrument for the Acceptation of the fame in the usual manner. Letters from the Frontiers, of the 28th Inflant, confirm the Accounts we have formerly received of the Resolutio 1 that the Enemy have taken to Reform some of the Duke of Anjou's Troops in the Netherlands, and to fend the rest into Spain, together with the Officers of those Regiments that shall be broken; and it is faid, these Forces are to begin their March towards that Kingdom on the 10th Instant. The Duke of Bavaria con inues at Compiegne, though he is daily expected at Namur.

Hazue, Jameiry 31. N.S. Lieutenant General Cadogan, having frequently, lince his Arrival in this Place, been in Corterence with the Council of State, concerning the necessary Dispositions for opening the Campaign, returned Yesterday to Bruffels. The fame Day there was an extraordinary Aifembly of the Ministers of the Allies, and Baron Schmettau,

the Pruffian Minister, and Monfieur Hetterman, Envoy from the Elector Palatine, had also a Conference with the Deputies of this State. Next Week they design to conclude an Agreement with Undertakers for supplying the Magazincs of the Frontiers with Corn and other Necessaries as foon as the Armies shall take the Field. The Council of State hath published a new Order, enjoining all such Officers as are at present in this Piace, if their Regiments are in the Low-Countries, to return immediately to their respective Commands. The last Advices from the North fay, that on the 20th Instant the Danish Army was on their march towards Childinsladt. Letters from France confirm the great warlike Preparations which are making in Alfatia and Lorrain under the Direction of the Count du Bourg, which General had received Orders from the Fresch Court to provide a great Train of Artillery for the Service of the enfuing Campaign. They write from Paris, that Marshal Villars had frequent Conferences with the French King, and also with the Dauphin and the Durchess of Burgundy; that General being somewhat recovered of his Wounds, it is believed he will be continued in the General Command of the Army in Flanders; but it is supposed that the Duke of Berwick will not accept of that of the Spanish Army in Arragon. These Letters add, that the Liberty which hath lately been given for the Importation of Corn without Duty, had very much diminished the Revenue of the Crown, and they were apprehensive that no other Impost could be laid on the People to supply this Desiciency in the present Conjuncture, without the Danger of a general Insurrection.

Forspreuth, January 24. Comodore Cornwell, en Board her Majesty's Ship the Swiftsure, is now under Sail, with the Rochester, Firme, Ruby, Swallow's Prize, and another Man of War for the Downs. Sir Charles Wager continues still at Spithead, on Board her Majesty's Ship the Windsor, with the Russel, Lancaster, Berwick, Ruperr, Warspight, Nonsuch, Feversham, Advice, Guernfey, Mary-Galley, Leopard and Phoenix Fire-ship.
