. Copenhagen, January 28. N. S. The Caroufal was performed last Night with great Magnificence. Yesterday a Fire happened at Malmos, on the other side of the Sound, which burnt down feveral Houses. On the 25th Instant an Express arrived here from Schonen, with Advice, that the Danish Detachment which was ordered to March towards Christianstadt, advanced before that Place on the 21st Instant, and possessed themselves of it without any other Opposition from the Enemy, but the Fire of a Bartalion, confisting of fix hundred Saxons who had formerly been Prisoners in Sweden, and being listed in the Swedish Service. were posted to defend that Place. The Saxons immediately furrendred themselves irisoners, and a Regiment or two of Swedish Horse, that were in the Town, retired upon the Approach of the Danes, who pursued them as far as Lundbye, which is six Miles di-stant from Christianstadt. By the taking of this Place, the Danes are become Masters of all the open Country in the Province of Schonen, and will entirely cut off the Communication the Swedes have hitherto had with Eafled, from whence they fent their Letters to Stralfund; to that our Advices from Stockholm must, for the future, be expected to be very irregular. Advices from Sweden say, that the new Levies were carried on with very good Success throughout their Dominions, and that above thirteen thousand Men were already listed. Letters from Paris advise, that the Negotiation between the Empire and France, for the Exchange of Prisoners, was regulated at Mon zingen near Brifac on the 13th of the last Month; by Vertue of which Treaty the Officers and Soldiers were released on both sides, and returning to their respective Regiments.
