Y SWYDDFA GYMREIG Town and Country Planning Act 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under Section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 which authorises the stopping up of that length of unnamed road at Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan, which extends from its junchon with Crystal Glen in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 160 yards, to enable housing development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of that Act.

Copies of the Order may be obtained free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Division, (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd), Graham Buildings, 139 Newport Road, Cardiff CF2 1YU (quoting the reference WR15/71/2) and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the County Solicitor to South Glamorgan County Council, 9th Floor, County Headquarters, Newport Road, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within six weeks of the 13th January 1975 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
