been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Michael and All Angels' Churchyard (North Side), Newburn, in the City of Newcastle upon Tyne, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 16th day of October 1974, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134) and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Michael and All Angels' Churchyard (North Side), Newburn, in the City of Newcastle upon Tyne, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the conditions that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a
