The Newport Borough Council (Adeline Street and Alice Street) (Weight Restriction) (Amendment) and (Milman Street) (Prohibition of Contract Carriages and Commercial Vehicles Exceeding 3 tons Unladen Weight) Order 1975.

Notice is hereby given that on 10th March 1975, the Newport Borough Council made the above-named Order, acting on behalf of the Gwent County Council in pursuance of arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 and in exercise of the Gwent County Council's powers under sections 1 (1), (2), (3) and (3AA) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, by Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and by section 1 of the Heavy Commercial Vehicles (Controls and Regulations) Act 1973.

The Order will come into operation on 22nd March 1975. The effects of the Order are that:

- (i) The County Borough of Newport (Adeline Street and Alice Street) (Weight Restriction) Order 1974, which is currently in operation and which affects Adeline Street and Alice Street, Newport, will be amended by increasing the unladen weight limit applied in it from 2½ tons to 3 tons.
- (ii) Contract carriages with an unladen weight exceeding 3 tons and heavy commercial vehicles will be prohibited from proceeding in Milman Street, Newport. (Note: "Contract carriage" is defined in the Road Traffic Act 1960 as a public service vehicle not carrying passengers at separate fares. "Heavy commercial vehicle" is defined in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as a vehicle constructed or adapted for the carriage of goods and which has an unladen weight exceeding 3 tons.)

Exceptions will be included in the Order to permit contract carriages exceeding 3 tons unladen weight and heavy commercial vehicles to proceed in Milman Street, Newport, for:

(i) access to premises situated on or adjacent to that road ;

(ii) the maintenance of that road or of any telegraphic line and the supply of gas, water or electricity; and

 (iii) fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes and in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the affected' roads may be inspected at my office during normal office hours (except Saturdays).

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and section 1 of the Heavy Commercial Vehicles (Controls and Regulations) Act 1973; or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks from 10th March 1975, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
