NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971
SECTION 210*The Aylesbury Vale (Wingrave Footpath No. 16) Public
Path Diversion Order 1975*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 1st April 1975, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment or to be confirmed by the Aylesbury Vale District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public right of way as described in the Schedule to this notice. The alternative route will commence 110 metres to the north of the Nup End Lane entrance, between the Methodist Chapel and 38 Nup End Lane and then proceed in a northerly direction, diverging from the existing path, for a distance of 90 metres to a point adjacent to the property known as 85 Winslow Road and 25 metres to the south-east of the existing footpath sign. With a minimum width throughout of 2 metres.

A copy of the Order and the plan contained in it has been deposited at the Aylesbury Vale District Council Offices, The Mall, Friars Square, Aylesbury, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned by the 23rd May 1975, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Aylesbury Vale District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

The Cambridgeshire County Council have proposed to the Secretary of State that he should use his power to confirm the above Order subject to proposed modifications at Wisbech and Ely.

*South Staffordshire District Council
Public Path (Kinver No. 52) Diversion Order, 1974*

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd April 1975 the South Staffordshire District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert that part of the public right-of-way commencing at Church Hill, Kinver and running in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 255 feet to the boundary of the Church Hall to a line almost parallel to the existing path and running in a general north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 210 feet and then for a distance of approximately 75 feet in a northerly direction to rejoin the existing path at the boundary of the Church Hall.
