The QUEEN has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal dated the 15th April 1975, to present the Reverend Geoffrey John Brett Stickland to the Benefice of Hardwicke, in Gloucestershire and the Diocese of Gloucester, now legally void and in Her Majesty's Gift for this turn only by reason of the avoidance of the See of Gloucester.

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 10th day of February 1975, to delegate to the six Counsellors of State therein named or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify

thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Sebastian's Churchyard, Great Gonerby, in the County of Lincolnshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 4th day of December 1974, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Anne, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, and in exercise of the powers conferred on Her Majesty by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (c. 134) and of all other powers in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Sebastian's Churchyard, Great Gonerby, in the County of Lincolnshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Sebastian's Churchyard, Great Gonerby, Lincolnshire) Order 1975.
