

Copies of the above-mentioned draft Side Roads Order and Compulsory Purchase Order and of the plans referred to therein have been deposited, and may be seen at all reasonable hours, free of charge, at the Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1, and at the offices of the Eastern Road Construction Unit, 59-63 Goldington Road, Bedford, and at the offices of the Northamptonshire County Council, County Hall, Northampton; the Buckinghamshire County Council, County Secretary and Solicitor, County Hall, Aylesbury, Bucks; Milton Keynes Borough Council, Sherwood House, Sherwood Drive, Bletchley, and Market Square, Stony Stratford, Bucks; Milton Keynes Development Corporation, Wavendon Tower, Wavendon, Bletchley, Bucks; and at the Loughton Sub Post Office, Loughton, Bletchley, Bucks; and the Bletchley Branch Library, Westfield Road, Bletchley, Bucks.

Proceedings on the above-mentioned draft Orders are being taken concurrently by virtue of section 53 of the Highways Act 1971. Persons wishing to make representations in connection with the above-mentioned proposals should attend or be represented at the Inquiry.

The Secretary of State hereby directs that any person who intends at the Inquiries to submit that any highway or proposed highway to which the draft Orders or either of them relate should follow an alternative route, or that, instead of improving, diverting or altering a highway to which the draft Orders or either of them relate, a new highway should be constructed on a particular route, shall send to him at Eastern Road Construction Unit, 59-63 Goldington Road, Bedford, not later than 16th May 1975 sufficient information about the alternative route or the route of the new highway, as the case may be, to enable it to be identified. Failure to comply with this direction will entitle the Secretary of State and the person holding the Inquiries to disregard so much of any objection as consists of such a submission.

Any person who proposes to make a submission about an alternative route for a highway or proposed highway, or about the construction of a new highway on a particular route instead of improving, diverting or altering a highway, is reminded of the power of the Secretary of State to disregard objections which in his opinion amount in substance to objections to the London-Holyhead Trunk Road (Diversion through Milton Keynes) Order 1974.

HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The A38 Exeter-Leeds Trunk Road and the A516 Nottingham-Derby-Stoke-on-Trent Trunk Road De-Trunking Order 1975

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 providing that lengths of the A38 Exeter-Leeds Trunk Road from its junction with Doles Lane to its junction with the southern slip road of Staker Lane roundabout and from its junction with the eastern slip road of Staker Lane roundabout to its junction with Warwick Avenue, A5111, together with lengths of the A516 Nottingham-Derby-Stoke-on-Trent Trunk Road for a distance of 366 yards west of its junction with Pastures Hospital Lane and from a point 153 yards east of its junction with Pastures Hospital Lane to a point 600 yards west of its junction with the A5111, shall cease to be trunk roads as from the date on which this Order comes into operation.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or the Highways Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirements of either of those Acts, or of any regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from 2nd May 1975 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The following is a draft of an Order proposed to be made by the Secretary of State for the Environment:—

ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS 1913 TO 1953

THE GROUP OF ROUND BARROWS NEAR HOPTON HOUSE, LITTLE CRESSINGHAM PRESERVATION ORDER 197

The Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953 and now vested in him, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

In this Order:

- (1) "the Act" means the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953;
- (2) "the monuments" means the ancient monuments shown on the plan annexed to this Order and thereon coloured pink known as Group of Round Barrows near Hopton House in the Parish of Little Cressingham in the County of Norfolk;
- (3) "the Secretary of State" means the Secretary of State for the Environment.

The monuments (with respect to which an interim preservation notice served under section 10 of the Act is in force) are hereby placed under the more lasting protection of the Secretary of State.

Any question as to a person's right to compensation under section 12 (2) of the Act, or as to the amount of any such compensation which is appropriate in the circumstances shall, both as respects this Order and as respects the interim preservation notice superseded by this Order, in default of agreement be determined by the Lands Tribunal as may appear to the Tribunal to be just.

This Order may be cited as the Group of Round Barrows near Hopton House, Little Cressingham Preservation Order 197 and shall come into operation on
