

question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may, under paragraph 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the 22nd May 1975 make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

Direction under Article 4 (3) (b) in respect of
Dormer Windows—Scarborough

Notice is hereby given that the Scarborough Borough Council, as District Planning Authority, on the 16th December 1974 made a Direction under Article 4 (3) (b) of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1973 as amended, in respect of the construction of dormer windows in the roofs of dwellinghouses.

This Direction has now been approved and made permanent by the Secretary of State for the Environment, and notice of his decision is hereby given in accordance with Article 4 (6) of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1973.

The effect of the Direction is to require that, within the parts of the Designated Scarborough Conservation Areas to which it relates, no dormer window may be constructed in the roof of a dwellinghouse without the prior grant of express planning permission by either the Scarborough Borough Council or, in the event of an appeal, by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Notice of Making of Article 4 Direction relating to
Gladstone Terrace, Sunnyside, Bishop Auckland

Notice is hereby given that the District Council of Wear Valley at their Meeting held on the 17th March 1975 made a Direction under Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1973 restricting permitted development in Classes I and II of Schedule I of the said Order (with the exception of the painting of house doors and windows) on all the properties in Gladstone Terrace, Sunnyside, Bishop Auckland.

The Direction will remain in force until the 18th September 1975 being six months from the date on which it was made and will then expire unless it has been approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

The effect of the Direction is that certain development which was formerly permitted under the above Order without planning permission will now require planning permission and a copy of the Direction and accompanying plan may be inspected at the Council Offices, "Highfield", Crook.

A planning application for planning permission must be made to the Wear Valley District Council for the following:

Any house extension at the front, rear, side or in the roof including porches, dormers, sun lounges and greenhouses.

Any greenhouse, garage, shed, stable, poultry shed, vehicular hard standing, oil storage tank, gate, fence, wall, vehicular access onto a highway and painting or rendering of house walls.
