

west. The length of footpath to be closed is approximately 85 metres. In substitution a footpath commencing at the junction of Gloucester Lane with Broad Marston Road will proceed along Broad Marston Road in a north-westerly direction for some 61 metres at which point it will change direction and proceed in a south-westerly direction for a distance of some 64 metres where it will rejoin the original route. The length of the proposed diversion is approximately 125 metres.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Cotswold District Council, 5 Dyer Street, Cirencester, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment with the Order.

- (b) The prior approval of the District Planning Authority may be required for the demolition of buildings within the Conservation Area. (Application for approval may be made separately or as part of an application for planning permission for the redevelopment of a site within the Conservation Area.)
