Grange Road West, Birkenhead (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the Wirral Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Merseyside, propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time during the whole 24 hours on all days in the lengths and on the sides of the roads specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order for vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight, to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded, to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein, to enable a vehicle to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and for a period of up to two hours for users of cars displaying the orange badge issued to disabled persons.

Wallasey.

# No Waiting at any time Lengths of roads in Birkenhead

1. Grange Road West, from its junction with Slatey Road for a distance of 13.7 metres in an easterly direction. North side.

2. Grange Road West, from a point 45 metres west of the westerly side of its junction with Eaton Road to a point 13.7 metres east of the easterly side of that junction. North side.

3. Grange Road West, from its junction with Slatey Road to

a point 13.7 metres east of the easterly side of its junction with Eaton Road. South side.

4. Eaton Road, from its junction with Grange Road West for a distance of 13.7 metres in a southerly direction. Both sides.

5. Slatey Road, from a point 13.7 metres south of the southerly side of its junction with Grange Road West to a point 13.7 metres north of the northerly side of that junction. East side.
