# WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Bradford) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 27) (Experimental) Order, 1975.

The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council propose to make an Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to:

(a) Provide bus lanes from 7.30 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. (Mondays to Fridays) (i) on the north-east and east sides of Keighley Road, Bradford, between its junctions with Frizinghall Road and Oak Lane; (ii) on the east and north-east side of Manningham Lane, Bradford, between its junctions with Oak Lane and Queens Road, and (iii) on the south-west side of Manningham Lane, Bradford, between its junctions with Drewton Street and Marlborough Road.

(b) Prohibit waiting by vehicles at any time and loading or unloading from 7.30 a.m. to 9 a.m. and from 4 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. (Mondays to Fridays) on the following lengths of road at Bradford:

1. Keighley Road, east side. From its junction with Oak Lane to its junction with Frizinghall Road.

2. Keighley Road, west side. From its junction with Oak

 Keightey Road, west side. From its junction with Oak Lane in a northerly direction for a distance of 39 metres.

Manningham Lane (full length).

4. Manor Row, north-east side. From its junction with Manningham Lane to its junction with Grammar School Road.

North Parade, south-west side. From its junction with Manningham Lane to its junction with Northgate.

The Order will contain exemptions for emergency service vehicles and certain vehicles when being used in pursuance of Statutory powers or duties. Exemptions will be included in proposal (b) for vehicles loading and unloading goods for up to 30 minutes and for disabled persons vehicles

except during the peak period loading and unloading ban.
The Order is to be an experiment and unless extended, can remain in force for a maximum period of 6 months. Full details of the proposal are in the draft Order which together with a plan and statement of reasons, may be examined during normal office hours at the County Hall (Room 226), Wakefield and at the DoPET Traffic Unit, Princes House, Wardley Centre, Bradford.

Except for certain specified exemptions, a building in a Conservation Area shall not be demolished without the consent of the local planning authority. An application for consent to demolish can, however, be made to the City Council.

Also, the effect of such designation extends the control over trees in the Conservation Area. Any person wishing to top, lop, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in the Conservation Area (subject to certain exemptions) shall give the City Council six weeks notice of his intention of
