The effect of the Orders, if confirmed without modification, will be:

No. 6. To divert Gayton Public Path (No. 6) from a point on the north-east boundary of the northern part of O.S. 97 in the parish of Gayton for 10 metres in a south-westerly direction, then 29 metres in a southerly direction, then 6 metres in a south-easterly direction, then 25 metres in a southerly direction, then 15 metres in a south-easterly direction, and finally 12 metres in a southerly direction to rejoin the existing path at the south-eastern boundary of the northern part of O.S. 97 in the parish of Gayton.

No. 7. To divert Gayton Public Path (No. 7) from a point on the north-west boundary of O.S. 97, on Winch Road, in the parish of Gayton, in a southerly direction for 26 metres, then in an easterly direction for 81 metres, then in a south-easterly direction for 10 metres, then in an easterly direction for 32 metres, and finally in a southerly direction for 42 metres to rejoin the existing path at the southern boundary of O.S. 97 in the parish of Gayton.

No. 8. To divert Gayton Public Path (No. 8) from a point on the north-west boundary of the northern part of O.S. 97, on Winch Road, in the parish of Gayton, in an easterly direction for 110 metres (in a position approximately 2 metres to the south of the existing path), then 18 metres in a southerly direction, then 47 metres in an easterly direction, and finally a further 32 metres in an easterly direction (in a position approximately 2 metres to the north of the existing path), to rejoin the existing path at the eastern boundary of the northern part of O.S. 97 in the parish of Gayton.

If no representations are so made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the West Norfolk District Council may instead of submitting the Orders to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Orders as unopposed Orders. If the Orders are submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

Designation of Conservation Area, Gellihaf, Maesycwmmwr, Mid Glamorgan

Notice is hereby given that the Rhymney Valley District Council, in exercise of their powers under the above Acts, have designated the area of Gellihaf, generally described in the Schedule hereto, as a Conservation Area.

The effects of such designation is that, subject to the provisions of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended by section 1 of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1974, and the exemptions contained therein, or made by virtue of, any statutory provision therein, no building or part of a building which is situated within the Conservation Area shall be demolished without the consent first obtained of either the Local Planning Authority, or the Secretary of State for the Environment.

(3) The area designated is bounded to the north, including the footpaths traversing plots No. 0040 and 0050, and including the southern boundary of Gellihaf House.

(4) The area designated is bounded to the west including the hedgerows of Parcel No. 7889, and including the western hedgerow of the unclassified road running Parcel No. 7889 in the north, to Gellihaf Isaf in the south.
