

- (b) to limit the period of waiting to 20 minutes (no return within 40 minutes) between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday in specified lengths of the South side of Coronation Street.

There are exceptions in the Order to permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down of passengers ;  
 (b) loading and unloading goods ; and where necessary, in connection with  
 (c) the maintenance of the road, and  
 (d) the supply of gas, electricity and water

The above restrictions will not apply to a vehicle which displays an authorised disabled persons badge issued by a local authority. These vehicles will be allowed to wait for up to a maximum period of 2 hours (no return within one hour).

A copy of the Order and a map showing the effected roads may be examined during normal office hours Monday to Friday at Room 206, Civic Centre, Barnstaple.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the 16th June 1975, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

#### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Devon County Council (Caen Street, Braunton)  
 (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading)  
 (Experimental) Order 1975*

Notice is hereby given that on 16th June 1975 the Devon County Council made an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 1st July 1975, is that in addition to the existing waiting restrictions in Caen Street, Braunton, you will not be allowed to load or unload your vehicle between 10 a.m. and 12 noon Monday to Saturday, from 1st July to 30th September this year in that length of Caen Street which extends from its junction with Chaloners Road and Exeter Road (A.361) westwards for a distance of 137 yards.

The existing waiting restrictions will not apply to a vehicle which displays an authorised disabled persons badge issued by a local authority. These vehicles will be allowed to wait for up to a maximum period of 2 hours (no return within one hour). Between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon for the period which this Order operates disabled persons vehicles will not be permitted to park in the above section of road.

A copy of the Order together with a map showing the length of road concerned may be examined during normal office hours Monday to Friday at Room 206, Civic Centre, Barnstaple.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the 16th June 1975, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

#### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Devon County Council (Cross Street, Barnstaple)  
 (Prohibition & Restriction of Waiting) Order 1975*

On 16th June 1975 the Devon County Council made an Order under sections 1 and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

When the Order comes into operation on 1st July 1975 the effect will be that you will not be permitted to cause any vehicle to wait:

- (a) at any time:  
 (i) on the east side of Cross Street ; or  
 (ii) in a specified length on the west side of Cross Street ;  
 (b) between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in a specified length on the west side of Cross Street.

There are exceptions in the Order to permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down of passengers ;  
 (b) loading and unloading of goods ;  
 (c) collecting and delivering postal packets for the Post Office ; and where necessary, in connection with  
 (d) the maintenance of the road, and  
 (e) the supply of gas, electricity and water

The above restrictions will not apply to a vehicle which displays an authorised disabled persons badge issued by a local authority. These vehicles will be allowed to wait for up to a maximum period of 2 hours (no return within one hour).

#### DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Dorset (Worth Matravers) (Prohibition of Waiting and Limited Waiting) Order 1969 (Amendment) Order 1975.*

Notice is hereby given that the Dorset County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2), (3) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

When this Order comes into effect the existing restrictions prohibiting waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. 15th March to 30th September inclusive in any year on the undermentioned length of road in the Parish of Worth Matravers in the District of Purbeck will be revoked and waiting will be prohibited at any time on the said length of road:

That length of unnamed road which joins the south-east side of Pikes Lane at a point 31 yards south-west of the road leading from St. Albans Head to Langton Matravers—on both sides between its junction with Pikes Lane and a point 25 yards south-east of that junction.

Exceptions will permit waiting for:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers,  
 (b) loading and unloading goods,  
 (c) disabled persons vehicles bearing the relevant badge issued by a local authority,

and, where necessary, in connection with:

- (d) the maintenance of the roads, and  
 (e) the supply of gas, electricity and water.

Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a plan showing the length of road affected and a Statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Friday at:

- (i) Dorset County Council, Transportation and Engineering Department, County Hall, Dorchester, Dorset ;  
 (ii) Purbeck District Council, Westport House, Wareham, Dorset.
