MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971 SECTION 12 (2) Direction Prohibiting Exercise of Powers in Relation to Controlled Drugs

Re: CHARLES WILLIAM JOHN HUNT

In accordance with section 12 (2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State gave the following direction which was served and thereby came into effect on 6th June 1975:

Whereas the authorities conferred by Regulations 4 and 10

of the Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Regulations 1964 on Charles

William John Hunt, B.Sc., M.B., B.Ch., by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner, to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which those Regulations applied were withdrawn in exercise of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 22 of the said Regulations by notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on 6th November 1970, the said Charles William John Hunt whose registered address was then 4 Pelham Street, South Kensington, London, S.W.7, having been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965:

And whereas the Secretary of State gave a direction by the said notice that it should not be lawful for the said Charles William John Hunt to give prescriptions prescribing any substance for the time being falling within Part 1 of the Schedule to the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965:

And whereas the said withdrawal of authorities and the operation of the said direction regarding prescriptions were suspended by notice published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on 1st May 1973:

Now, in pursuance of section 12 (2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, read with paragraph 3 (2) of Schedule 5 to the Act, I hereby direct that the said Charles William John Hunt be prohibited from having in his possession,

John Hunt be prohibited from having in his possession, prescribing, administering, manufacturing, compounding and supplying and from authorising the administration and supply of any of the substances and products for the time being specified in paragraphs 1 to 5 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 to the said Act.

Town and Country Planning Act, 1971
