Buckinghamshire County Council (Prohibition of Cycling on Footpaths) (Great Marlow) Order 1975

CANTERBURY CITY COUNCIL

The Canterbury City Council (Old Dover Road) (Width Restriction) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th June 1975 the Canterbury City Council, acting on behalf of the Kent County Council pursuant to an Agreement under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, made the above-named Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended.

This Order will come into operation on the 27th June 1975 and will make it unlawful for any person, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, to cause any vehicle the width of which, inclusive of any load on the vehicle, exceeds 6 feet 6 inches to proceed in that length of Old Dover Road in the City of Canterbury which extends from its junction with New Dover Road A.2 to its junction with Nackington Road.

Exceptions will operate to permit the use of the above-mentioned length of Old Dover Road by any vehicle with a width in excess of 6 feet 6 inches if the vehicle is being used:

- (a) for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to that length of road;
- (b) as a stage carriage;
- (c) for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to that length of road or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon that land;
- (d) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes; or
- (e) in connection with any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to that length of road, the removal of any obstruction to traffic in that length of road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road, or the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to that length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878.

CHRISTCHURCH BOROUGH COUNCIL

Borough of Christchurch (Waiting Restrictions) Order, 1975

Notice is hereby given that the Christchurch Borough Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968.

When this Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle at any time on the following lengths of road:

1. *Jumpers Road/Grove Road West:*

(a) south side of Jumpers Road from its junction with Grove Road West in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 64 metres;

(b) south side of Grove Road West from its junction with Jumpers Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 22 metres;

(c) north side of Grove Road West from its junction with Jumpers Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 24 metres;

(d) south side of Jumpers Road from its junction with Grove Road West in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 20 metres.
