(i) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading

of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) will be prohibited between 8 a.m. and 6.30

(ii) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place will be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive;

(iii) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle will be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Harrow Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(iv) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, will be pro-

hibited:

- (b) in Kenton Road on the north-west side, between a point 5 feet south-west of a point opposite the north-eastern wall of No. 161 Kenton Road and the southwestern kerb line of Carlton Avenue, the hours during which the existing prohibition applies on the waiting by vehicles including waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle will be changed so that it will apply at any time of the day or night throughout the week
