TYNE AND WEAR COUNTY COUNCIL

Tyne and Wear County Council (Blackett Street, Newcastle upon Tyne) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that Tyne and Wear County Council propose to make an Order under Section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

When the Order comes into operation it shall have the following effect:

- (a) To prohibit all motor vehicles except for Public Service vehicles and vehicles requiring access to premises in Blackett Street, to enter Blackett Street from the east at its junction with Pilgrim Street.
- (b) To prohibit all motor vehicles except for Public Service vehicles and construction vehicles requiring access to Blackett Street from entering Blackett Street from the west at its junction with Percy Street.
- (c) To prohibit all motor vehicles (other than Public Service vehicles) travelling in either direction in Blackett Street to proceed beyond a point 10 metres west of the eastern leg of Eldon Square.

Noting in Article 2 shall apply to any police, fire brigade or ambulance vehicles or statutory undertakers vehicles on emergency call or to a local authority vehicle requiring access for the purpose of the performance of statutory duties.

The provisions of Article 3 and of paragraph (b) of the First Schedule to the Tyne and Wear County Council (Monument, Newcastle upon Tyne) Temporary Traffic Regulation (No. 1) Order 1974 insofar as they relate to Blackett Street, Newcastle upon Tyne are hereby revoked.

SOUTHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL

The City of Southampton (Bitterne Road/Pound Street) (Prohibition of Right Hand Turn) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that Southampton City Council made the above Order on 19th June 1975 pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Hampshire County Council and in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under

Section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

The effect of this Order which comes into operation on 30th June 1975 is to prohibit vehicles travelling west in Bitterne Road from making a right turn into Pound Street.

The reason for making this Order is to remove a dangerous traffic movement which has resulted in several accidents in the past.

If you wish to question the validity of this Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or that any of the requirements of that Act have not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from the 19th June 1975 apply to the High Court for this purpose.—Dated 22nd June 1975.

County of Avon (Reservoir Road, Durdham Down, Bristol) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Prohibition of Entry) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Avon propose to make an Order under Section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be:
