ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1967—SECTION 21
Pedestrian Crossings Scheme

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Avon have made an Order with the consent of the Secretary of State for the Environment, under section 21 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, and section 254 of the Local Government Act 1972 varying the "Scheme for the Establishment of Crossings for Foot Passengers" in Weston-super-Mare, District of Woodspring, by replacing the following uncontrolled (zebra) crossings with a light controlled (pelican) crossing:

Across Royal Parade, Weston-super-Mare, opposite the north side of the Public Footpath to South Parade, north of the Winter Gardens.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks after the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL

The City of Birmingham District Council (Parking of Goods Vehicles) (Amendment) (No. 1) Order, 1975

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th June 1975, the City of Birmingham District Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, with the County Council of West Midlands, made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 the effect of which will be to amend The City of Birmingham (Parking of Goods Vehicles) (No. 1) Order 1973:

(a) by prohibiting the waiting of goods vehicles over 2 tons unladen weight between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. on any day of the week and in addition between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays (the existing restriction is in respect of goods vehicles over 30 cwt. unladen weight);

(b) by including the following lengths of road: Aylesbury Crescent, Burnham Road, Clapton Grove, Collingdale Road, Eltham Grove, Lisson Grove, Mayfair Close, Smalldale Road;

(c) by excluding the following lengths of road: Austell Grove, Aylesbury Road, Banners Walk, Beasley Grove, Blenheim Way, Burham Road, Elton Grove, Kelwell Grove, Lisbon Grove, Manfield Close, Tyler Grove, Farrow Road, Winster Grove.
