(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County of North Yorkshire propose to make an Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the waiting by vehicles at any time in any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice and between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in respect of any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice.

The Order contains exceptions to permit persons to allow vehicles to wait to pick up or set down passengers to load or unload goods to deliver or collect postal packets for the Postmaster General and where necessary in order to be used for building or demolition operations the repair or reconstruction of roads or services therein or in pursuance of statutory powers or duties. Provision has also been made to permit vehicles used by disabled and blind persons to park on the roads for a period not exceeding two hours provided that there are displayed on the vehicles the relevant badge and disc.

Full details of the Order, a map showing the lengths of roads affected by it and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for proposing to make the Order may be seen at the office of the Chief Executive, Council Offices, Harrogate, HG1 2SG between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the order may be sent in writing to the Chief Executive of the Council of the Borough of Harrogate, Council Offices, Harrogate, before the 24th July 1975.
