If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX to the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 26th June 1975, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
