(d) the supply of gas, electricity and water, or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878.

The Order also contains an exception in respect of vehicles being used by, or for the transport of disabled persons, and on which are displayed the Orange Badge prescribed in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations, 1975, provided that such vehicles shall not wait for a period in excess of two hours and any unbrowned methics in the success of two hours and any subsequent parking in the same road shall not take place before one hour has elapsed.
