**DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL**

*The County of Dorset (Holdenhurst Road, Bournemouth) (One-Way Street) Order 1975*

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd June 1975 the Dorset County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2), (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972.

The effect of this Order which comes into operation on 27th June 1975 will be:

- (i) The County Borough of Bournemouth (Hayes Avenue, Holdenhurst Road and Queen's Park South Drive) (Prohibition of Entry) Order 1965 is revoked;
- (ii) all vehicles will be prohibited from proceeding on that length of Holdenhurst Road to be incorporated in the enlarged Queens Park Roundabout in other than a north-easterly to south-westerly direction.

**DURHAM COUNTY COUNCIL**

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1967

*The County of Durham (Ritson Street, Stanley) (Experimental Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1975*

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council propose to make an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act, 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act, 1974.

When the Order comes into effect no one will be permitted to allow a vehicle to wait at any time in that length of Ritson Street at Stanley in the Derwentside District from its junction with the new access road to the Stanley By-pass for a distance of 60 metres in a north-easterly direction for a period of six months.

Exemptions in the Order will permit waiting for the purposes of:—

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) building operations or demolitions;
- (d) the maintenance of the roads and the removal of obstructions;
- (e) the supply of gas, water or electricity;
- (f) the collection or delivery of postal packets;
- (g) invalid carriages;
- (h) Police, Fire Brigade and Ambulance vehicles.
