DURHAM COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Durham (Freemans Place, Durham City) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1975

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council on the 26th June 1975 made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act, 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting at any time in the lengths of road at Freemans Place in Durham City as set out in the Schedule to this notice.

The Order contains the usual exemptions permitting waiting for the purposes of police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, picking up and setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, building and roadworks and maintenance of essential services.

The Order will come into operation on the 30th June 1975.

- (b) From a point 30 feet north of the entrance to the Durham Carpet Factory for a distance of 127 feet in a northerly direction. (774)

MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

Mid Glamorgan County Council (The Twyn, Caerphilly) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that on the 13th June 1975 the County Council of Mid Glamorgan made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, the effect of which is that traffic will proceed along the length of road known as The Twyn which extends from its junction with Clifton Street (A.469) to its junction with Cardiff Road/Castle Street (A.469) from east to west only.

An exemption is provided in the Order to enable a mechanical road sweeper to operate during certain hours.
