Bridgnorth District Council (Part of Footpath 155 at Brosley) Public Path Diversion Order (No. 1) 1975

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 19th May 1975 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Bridgnorth District Council as an unopposed Order.

The Borough of Dudley (Union Passage) Public Path Diversion Order, 1975

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 27th June 1975, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State at the Department of the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Dudley Metropolitan Borough Council as an unopposed Order.
