TORFAEN BOROUGH COUNCIL

Torfaen Borough Council (Parkes Lane, Tranch, Pontypool) (Weight Restriction) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the Torfaen Borough Council acting under agency arrangements with the Gwent County Council propose to make an Order under Section 1(1) (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972.

The proposed Order will make it unlawful for any person to cause any vehicle, the unladen weight of which exceeds 3 tons, to proceed in that length of road specified in the

Schedule hereto.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order if the vehicle is being used:

- (a) for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to that length of road;
- (b) for the purpose of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to that length of road or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon that land;
- (c) in connection with any building operation or demoli-tion in or adjacent to that length of road, the removal of any obstruction to traffic in that length of road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to that length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraphic Act 1878; or
- (d) in the course of military training operations.

A copy of the proposed Order and a map showing the lengths of road affected may be inspected at the office of the undersigned during normal office hours.

Objections to the proposals giving the grounds on which they are made must be sent, in writing to the undersigned not later than the 3rd September 1975.—Dated 11th August 1975.

The Newport Borough Council (Harrhy Street, Station Street and Railway Street) (Parts) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and One-way Traffic) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that on the 4th August 1975 the Newport Borough Council made the above Order acting on behalf of the Gwent County Council in pursuance of arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 and in exercise of the Gwent County Council's powers under Sections 1(1), (2), (3) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 Act 1974.

The effects of the Order are:

- (a) vehicles may not wait at any time on parts of Harrhy Street, Railway Street and Station Street, Newport;
- (b) vehicles may not wait between 8 am and 6 pm Mondays to Saturdays, on part of Harrhy Street,
- (c) a two-way traffic system has been introduced in Harrhy Street and part of Station Street, Newport;

(d) various existing Orders have been revoked or amended to effect the proposals detailed in items (a), (b) and (c).

Exceptions have been included in the Order to permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods:
- (c) delivery or collection of postal packets;
- (d) the maintenance of the roads;
- (e) the supply of gas, water and electricity and of any telegraphic line;
- (f) the pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
- (g) a funeral.

A copy of the Order, a map showing the affected roads may be inspected at my office between 8.30 am and 4.30 pm

Monday to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks from the 4th August 1975 apply to the High Court for this purpose.—Dated 11th August 1975.

- In parts of Thornhill Park Road and in short lengths of Simon Way and Candy Lane at their junction with Thornhill Park Road.
- In parts of Warburton Road and in short lengths of Warburton Close, Lydgate Road and the service road serving Numbers 60 to 74 at their junction with Warburton Road.
- In parts of Tunstall Road and in a short length of the service road to Hightown School at its junction with Tunstall Road.
- In parts of Burgoyne Road.
- In a short length of Kathleen Road at its junction with Burseldon Road.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the effect of the Order may be inspected in Room 20 of my office during normal working hours.

If you wish to question the validity of this Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or that any of the requirements of that Act have not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within six weeks from the 4th August 1975 apply to the High Court for this purpose.—Dated 8th August 1975.
