## HONOURS AND AWARDS

#### CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD

St. James's Palace, London S.W.1. 3rd October 1975.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the Queen's Gallantry Medal to the undermentioned:

Awarded the Queen's Gallantry Medal

William Daniel LICKISS, Member, Legislative Assembly of Queensland. Now Minister of Survey, Valuation, Urban and Regional Affairs.

On 28th January 1974, Mr. Lickiss was engaged in flood relief operations in the Mogill area near Brisbane.

Mr. Lickiss was thrown into the flood waters and partially stunned by the effects of an electrical discharge from overhead high tension wires to the Army vessel in which he was working, but he managed to swim back to the craft. He then realised that a soldier, who had been critically affected by the same shock, was still in the water. Mr. Lickiss immediately dived overboard and swam to the man despite being in flood waters some 33 feet in depth, with the real possibility of high tension wires being around him in the water together with debris and submerged objects. He managed with extreme difficulty to bring the soldier back to the craft, but unfortunately the man died as a result of electrocution.

In unhesitatingly going to the assistance of the drowning soldier, in dangerous and hazardous conditions, Mr. Lickiss displayed courage of an extremely high order and a complete disregard for his personal safety.
