NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

Welwyn Hatfield District Council (Lemsford Lane, Welwyn Garden City), Diversion of Public Footpath Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that on the 24th October 1975 the Welwyn Hatfield District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from a point in Lemsford Lane, Welwyn Garden City (330 feet south-east of the junction with Handside Lane) in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 250 feet, then in a southerly direction for a distance of 330 feet near the edge of the woodland at the rear of the Drill Hall, to:

- (a) a point in Lemsford Lane (opposite its junction with Handside Lane) in a south-westerly direction parallel with the existing right of way for a distance of 425 feet, then for a distance of 660 feet in a south-easterly direction where it joins the existing public right of way; and
- (b) a point in Lemsford Lane (330 feet east of its junction with Stacklands) in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 980 feet to where it joins the existing public right of way.
