ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT 1931

Regulations made by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under section 13 of the above-mentioned Act have been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and are published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the Regulations are applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council on or before the 8th day of December 1975.

ARCHITECTS REGISTRATION COUNCIL OF THE UNITED KINGDOM

REGULATIONS MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 13 OF THE ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT 1931, AMENDING THE EXISTING REGULATIONS.

1. Delete Regulations 41 and 42.
2. Delete the existing Disciplinary Regulations and substitute the following new Regulations:

DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

1. (a) An application to the Council to require a registered person to answer allegations that he has been guilty of conduct disgraceful to him in his capacity as an architect shall be in writing under the hand of the person making the application (hereinafter referred to as "the applicant") in the form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations and shall be sent to the Registrar of the Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Registrar") together with an Affidavit by the applicant stating the matters of fact on which he relies in support of his application.

(b) If it shall appear to the Council on consideration of the application and the Affidavit that it is necessary, the Council shall direct the Discipline Committee to hold an inquiry into the case in accordance with section 7 of the Act and the Regulations following, and the Registrar shall forthwith cause to be served on the registered person a copy of the application and affidavit and on the registered person and on the applicant notice as to the time and place when and where such inquiry will be held. Such notice, which may be in the form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, shall be served at least 49 days before the date appointed for the inquiry and shall require the applicant and the registered person respectively to furnish to the Clerk of the Discipline Committee and to each other a list of all the documents on which they respectively propose to rely; such list shall, unless otherwise ordered by the
