#### Present,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Eighton Banks, in the Borough of Gateshead, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Thomas' Churchyard, in the said Parish, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

#### Provided that-

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stone-work or brick-work properly cemented.


(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 5th day of March next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 5th day of March.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

The draft regulations complete the entitlement conditions for Invalid Care Allowance, the legislative framework having been laid down in the Social Security Act 1975. This is a new benefit for people who care for severely disabled relatives and it is planned to be introduced during 1976-77.

A severely disabled person is defined by the 1975 Act as a person for whom an attendance allowance is payable. The draft regulations extend this definition and also prescribe the amount of care required to qualify for Invalid Care Allowance.

The draft regulations list a wide range of relatives the care of whom may confer entitlement to the allowance and they prescribe the circumstances in which increases may be paid for child or adult dependents. The conditions relating to residence and presence in Great Britain are set out together with other provisions of a technical nature.
