An Abstract of the Act made in the Eighth Year of Her Majesty's Reign, Entituled. An All for laying certain Duties upon Canales, and cortain Rates upon Monies to be given with Clerks and Apprentices, towards raising Her Majesty's Supply for the Year 1710; so far as it relates to the Duties on Candles.

DY this Act a Dury is charged of four Pence per Pound on all Candles made or Wax, or any Mixture therewith, and a Half-peny per Pound on all other Candles imported or made in Great Britain during five Years, commencing the first of May 1710, to be paid by the Impor-ters or Makers; and all Candles imported that shall be landed without Warrant or Payment of the Duties are to

The Duties upon Candles imported are to be levied and managed by the respective Commissioners and Officers of the Customs in England and Scotland, and the Duties on Candles made in Great Britain by the respective Commisfiners and Officers of the Excise, and to be paid into the Exchequer in England.

All Makers of Candles are, before the faid first of May, togive Notice in Writing at the next Excise-Office, of the Places where they make or keep their Candles, or melt or keep their Wax, Tallow, or other Materials to be made into Candles, and of their Utenfils for that purpose; and from thenceforth no Maker of Candles is to erect, change, or alter his Place of making or keeping Candles, or his Materials to make into Candles, or his Urenfils for that purpose, without giving the like Notice in Writing, under the Penalty of 501.

All Makers of Candles within the Weekly Bills of Mortality are once in every Month, and those in the other Parts of Great Britain once in every fix Weeks, to make true Entries at the next Excise-Office of all Candles made by them. The Entries to contain the Weight. Number, and Size of the Candles, and what Quantities made in each Course in the several Weeks, under Fenalty of 20 l. which And the Gid During within the Bilts of Mortaling and

And the faid Duties within the Bills of Mortality are within one Month, and in all other Paris within fix Weeks after Entry, to be paid off under Penalty of double Dury, and not to fell any Candles unt I paid off, under Penalty of double the value of the Candles.

The Officers are to have Entry by Day, and in the Night, in the Presence of a Constable, to take an Account by Weight, Taie, or otherwise, of the Candles made, and to make Return thereof in Writing, which shall be a Charge on the Maker, and the Officers are to leave Copies of such Returns with the Makers, if demanded, under Penalty

of 40 s.

The Officers for the faid Duties are to take an Oath 'or the faithful Execution of their Trufts, to be administred by the Commissioners of Excise, or Justices of the Peace, who are to give Certificate thereof.

The Makers of Canales are to keep just Scales and Weights at their Places of making, and permit and affilt the Officers to make use thereof for aftertaining the Duties, under Penalty of 101.

The Officers may take an Account, by gauging, weighing, or otherwise, of all Wax. Tallow, or other Materials ter making of Candles, and make a Charge upon mission of the control fing thereo; or any part thereo, and not receiving Satifiaction what is become of it, not exceeding 168 Younds of Candidate of the Candidate of Cand of Candles for 112 Pounds of Materials milling, and fo proportionably.

Any Maker of Candles that obstructs an Officer in the Execution of the Fowers given by this Act forteits 20 1-

No Maker of Candles, under Penalty of 201. shall remove, carry, or fend away any Candles of which the Officer has not first raken an Account, without giving twenty four hours Notice to the Officer within the weekly Bills, and two Days Notice in all other Parts, of his Incention fo to do.

All Candles nor furveyed to be kept separate from those that are, for eventy four hours within the Bills of Mortality, and two Days in all other Parts, under Penalty of

A Maker of Candles, for Candles or Materials concealed. forfeits 20 l. and the Candles or Materials concealed, and

all concealed Utenfils are to be forfeited.

No Persons are to use any Lamps in their Dwelling-houses wherein any Oyl or Fat shall be burn, other than Oyl made of Fish within Great Britain, on Penalty of 40 s.

No Candles shall be put to Sale but in shops or Warehouses used for that purpose, or in publick Fairs or Markets, under Penalty of 5 l.

Candles, Materials, and Utenfils are made liable to Debts

and Duties in Arrear.

Persons that make Candles for their own priva e Use only may compound for 12 d. per Head per Annum, and not be furveyed, but must not sell or increase their Families without Notice, and paying for the Persons added.

All Candles in the Possession of Persons that sell or deal

in Candles, or any in Truth for them, on the first or May, are subjected to the same Duties, and are to be cutred at the next Excise Office, on pain of forseiting 501, and of the Candles not entred; and on Payment of the Duty for fuch Stock within fix Days after the first of May, Allowance shall be made after the Rate of 10 per Cent, and if not paid within fix Days, Security must be given to pay in three Months after the first of May; and such as neglect to pay or fecure, forfeit double Duty.

Those that conceal or convey away Stock, forfelt 20 I. and the Candles so concealed, &c. And those that do not discover Stock in their Hands, forfelt 5 s. for every found Weight.

The Laws of Excise to be in Force for levying these Duties, unless where other Provision is made by this

The Duties of Candles experted are to be repaid. The Fines and Penalties are to be recovered as by the Liws of Excise, and go one Moiery to the Queen, and the other to the Informer.

Candles cracked or spoiled are to be desiced by the Officer, and the Du y thereof allowed.

Persons that fell Candles by Contracts already made,

may add the Dury to the Price contracted for.

Small Rush Lights once dipped or drawn through
Grease, or Kitchen Stuff, and not through Tallow melect or refined, made by Persons to be used only in their own Houses, not liable to Daty; fo as none be fold, delivered out, or made for Sale.

Y Rerday the General Council being met at the usual hour, the Differer ces then remaining, with regard to the Grand Treasurer's being intrusted with the whole Taxes that are to be railed for the publick Service, were finally determined. The Treasurer is to have the whole Revenue under his Direction, only with this Restriction. ction; that he shall give in his account to the Senate, and be obliged to proceed with Diligence against Deficients. After this the Diet proceeded to pass the Acts they had already formed, which is done with no other Solemnity, than by reading them over in the publick Affembly. The first Act was for confirming the Diet of Lubsio, and declaring that all the Taxes imposed by them should be held of equal Force with those granted at the General Council. Then they proceeded to read the several Acts by them made for fettling the necessary Funds for the Sublistence of the Army, and the Service of the Republick. The first was for laying a Duty of one Timph, or nine Pence Sterling, on every heet of fmall Stampt Paper; and on every Sheet of the larger fort that passes the King's Hinds, and is generally used in Grants, Gifis, and Commissions, two Rix-Dollars, or nine Shillings Sterling. The next they read was an Act for laying a Duy on Corn, Cattle, Leather, Wax, and fuch like Commodities that shall be imported into, or experted cut of this Kingdom, for which the Merchant shall pay after the Rate of ten per Centlikewise passed another Act, whereby every twenty one Houses were obliged to provide one Foot Soldier, and to advance one hundred and forty Polish Guilders for his Arms and Cloaths, and one hundred Polish Guilders for his Yearly Fay. On this Project the feveral Palatines have undertaken to levy and pay all the Infantry of their Ar-The Cavairy is to be raifed and paid out of the k Treasury.
