Bridle Paths and Footpath Diversion Order 1976

Notice is hereby given, that the above-named Order, made on 24th February 1976, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order by the Hertfordshire County Council.

The effect of the Order will be as follows:

The public rights of way over the land situate at Thundridge and Standon coloured black on the Order map and described in "A" of the Schedule hereto shall be extinguished at the expiration of 28 days from the date of confirmation of the Order.

There shall be at the expiration of 28 days from the date of confirmation of the Order a Bridle Path and a footpath over the land situate at Thundridge and Standon described in "B" of the Schedule hereto and coloured black and white on the Order map.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the offices of the Hertfordshire County Council, Room 204, County Hall, Hertford, Hertfordshire, and at the offices of the East Herts District Council, 2 Hockerill Street, Bishop's Stortford, Hertfordshire.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Secretary, Hertfordshire County Council, County Hall, Hertford, Hertfordshire, before the 5th April 1976, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the Hertfordshire County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have

been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

SCHEDULE A

Existing Route to be Stopped up

BR 24 Thundridge Parish

That Part of BR 24 commencing at point "A" on the map, at the north-west corner of OS 162, then running in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 270 yards to its junction with BR 32 at point "B" on the map at the north-east corner of OS 162.

FP 30 Thundridge Parish

The whole of FP 30 from the County Road at point "C" on the map to its junction with BR 24 at point "A" on the map.

BR 32 Thundridge Parish

BR 64 Standon Parish

The whole of the BR 32 from its junction with BR 24 at point "B" on the map northwards and westwards for a distance of approximately 166 yards to its junction with BR 64 at the Parish Boundary and that part of BR 64 from its junction with BR 32 at the Parish Boundary, in a westerly and northerly direction for a distance of approximately 390 yards to point "E" on the map approximately 36 yards north of Harecroft Brow, the length of BR 64 from the junction with FP 65 at point "F" on the map, for a distance of approximately 210 yards northwards to point "E" on the map to be retained as a footpath.

SCHEDULE B

New Route

A bridleway commencing at the aforementioned point "A" and running generally in a north-easterly direction along the banks of the River Rib for approximately 277 yards to the junction with BR 32 at the aforementioned point "B".

A footpath commencing from the County Road at the aforementioned point "C" running in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 260 yards to its junction with BR 24 at point "D" on the map.

A bridleway commencing at the junction with BR 24 at point "D" on the map thence crossing the River Rib and running in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 396 yards to the north-east corner of Harecroft Brow, thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 110 yards to rejoin the existing route of BR 64 at point "E" on the map. The County Council of Humberside, Parish of Cherry Burton (No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order, 1976

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 25th February 1976 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the County Council of Humberside.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way in the Parish of Cherry Burton running from a point at the eastern end of Rose Lane in a generally north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 500 yards to a point situate approximately 300 yards north-east of Rose Cottage Farm, to a line commencing at the same point at the eastern end of Rose Lane and leading in a generally north-easterly direction along a cart road to a point situate approximately 20 yards west of Rose Cottage Farm, and then generally in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 50 yards along the eastern boundary of Field No. 5880 on the Ordnance Survey Map Sheet Numbers TA 0042 and TA 0142 (1971 Edition), and then continuing in a generally north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 250 yards to a point situate at the south-eastern side of Field No. 7687 on the said Ordnance Survey Map, and then leading in a generally north-westerly direction along the eastern boundary of the said Field Ordnance Survey No. 7687 to a
