Braintree Public Path Diversion Order, 1975*

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th March 1976, the Braintree District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public right of way running from a point approximately 42 yards from the rear boundaries of Nos. 28/30 Connaught Gardens, Braintree, for a distance of approximately 63 yards in a north-westerly direction to a line running from the aforementioned point for a distance of 72 yards along a footpath adjacent to a cul-de-sac now under construction and known as Trafalgar Way, Braintree.
