NATIONAL COAL BOARD

OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act, 1958, on 4th March 1976, granted to the National Coal Board the Park Meadow Authorisation 1976 to work coal by opencast operations or to cause or permit coal to be worked by such operations.

The aggregate of the land specified in the authorisation as land which the National Coal Board will require to occupy for the purpose of enabling operations to be carried out for, or incidental to, the fulfilment of the purposes:

- (a) of working coal by opencast operations in pursuance of the authorisation, and
- (b) of restoring land affected by the working of coal in pursuance of the authorisation or by operations connected therewith,

is the land described in the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the authorisation and of the map referred to therein have been deposited at the offices of the National Coal Board Opencast Executive, Denby Disposal Point, Smithy Lane, Denby, Derbyshire, and also at the Ripley Public Library, Grosvenor Street, Ripley, Derbyshire, and may be seen there at all reasonable hours.

The authorisation becomes operative on the date on which this notice is first published in a local newspaper, or the date on which it is first published in the *London Gazette*, whichever is the later date; but a person aggrieved by the authorisation may, by application to the High Court within 6 weeks from the operative date, question its validity on the grounds:

- (a) that the authorisation is not empowered to be granted, or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by failure to comply with any statutory requirement relating to the authorisation.

Land Comprised in the Authorisation

The land which is about 109 acres in extent is in the Parish of Denby, in the District of Amber Valley in the County of Derby. It is situated north of Denby Village, about two miles west of the centre of Heanor and about three-quarters of a mile south-south-east of Marehay. It lies between Derby Road (A.61) to the north-west and the length of the unclassified county road known as Church Street, High Bank and Denby Common to the south and south-east and is south of the property known as The Bushes and west of Common Farm.
