Turin, April 30. N. S.

BY former Letters from the Frontiers we had an Account, that fourteen Battalions were detached from Dauphiné and Savoy towards Germany and the Netherlands; but our last Advices assure us, that sixteen Battalions and six Regiments of Horse are marched for Alliance and Flanders, who are to be replaced by the Troops which came last Year from Spain, and have been quartered in Languedoc and Provence; and the Cavalry is to be reinforced by some Troops from Franche Comte. The same Advices add, that the Duke of Berwick was daily expected at Grenoble, in order to visit the Posts on the Frontiers, and assemble the Troops with the utmost Expedition. Last Sunday being the Anniversary of the Duke d' Aost's Birth-Day, all the foreign Ministers went to the Venerie, to make their Compliments to their Royal Highnesses on that Occasion. The same Day a Courier arrived here from the Hague, and on Monday another from Vienna, with Letters for his Royal Highness, the British and Dutch Ministers, concerning the Differences depending between this and the Imperial Court. The Letters which we received by the Courier from Vienna, which are of the 22d Instant, brought an Account, that Marshal Thaua was upon his Departure for Milan, where he is expected the next Week, and three British Men of War attend at Genoa to convoy him to Barcelona. Yesterday the Count de Rocque, Lieutenant General of Foot, and Governor of Alexandria, set out from this Place for his Government, to regulate the Garrison there, and give other necessary Orders, that he may be at Liberty to make the Campaign.

Milan, May 3. N. S. The Imperial Troops that were quartered in this Duchy, and the Neighbouring States, are on their March towards Piedmont, and two thousand Men have already entered that Principality. The great Preparations which are made for prosecuting the War on the Frontiers of Savoy, give us very hopeful prospects of a successful and advantageous Campaign. The Marshal Thaua is expected here this Evening from Vienna, in his way to Turin, where he is to concert with his Royal Highness the necessary Dispositions for taking the Field, and the Operations for the ensuing Year. General Stanhope arrived here on the 1st Instant; and yesterday Morning he proceeded to Genoa. Letters from thence say, that two British Men of War had taken and brought into that Port a French Privateer called the Prince of Frize, carrying thirty six Pieces of Cannon and one hundred and forty Men; and that an English Merchantman had taken four laden Corn Ships, and sold them at Malta and Cagliari. Advices from Rome of the 26th of the last Month say, that the Pope continued in his Resolution to remove to Castel Gandolfo on the 10th Instant, his Physicians being of Opinion that the Change of Air is necessary to confirm his Health, after his recovery from his late Indispositions. The Affair of Comamachio is still under Deliberation, and meets with very great Difficulties. The Congregation appointed to confer with the Imperialists on this Subject, ground their Pretensions on divers Ancient Grants of the Dukes of Modena, by which that Fief was given to the Church, of which they have produced several Copies; but the Imperial Commissioners acknowledge, that they are not satisfied that those are faithful

Copies; whereupon they have resolved to take a new Translation from the Originals. The Court of Madrid having formerly Prohibited all Spaniards by an Edict, from applying themselves to the Da'ry, or continuing in Rome after a limited time, which is now expiring, and no Account being yet brought that this Act is repealed, or the Differences between the Courts of Rome and Madrid adjusted, the Spaniards are in great Consternation, and in Perplexity how to act on this Occasion.

Hamburg, May 9. N. S. Letters from Warsaw of the 27th of April say, that the Republick had consented to take into their Service six thousand Horse on the same Establishment as the Army of the Crown, and three thousand on that of Lithuania, wherewith the King is to supply them on certain Conditions, stipulated between his Majesty and the State; and also nine thousand Foot, that his Majesty hath engaged to raise for the same Service. By this Means, all the Forces, according to the Regulation of the last General Diet, will be compleatly levied much sooner than was expected. The Army of Lithuania is ordered to join the Muscovites before Riga. Letters from Bender, of the 17th of March, bring us certain Advices of the King of Sweden's continuance in that Place. His Majesty was then preparing for his Journey, though it was uncertain which way he would take to return to his Dominions. Colonel Schewrin and Secretary Hogewall arrived there on the 26th of February.

Frankfort, May 11. N. S. This Day the Imperial Troops are to begin their March towards the respective Camps appointed for them. The French Army is assembling between Haguenau and Strasburg, and a flying Party will encamp in the Neighbourhood of Brisac. The Enemy have detached great Bodies to reinforce the Army in Flanders; they expect to be joined by several Battalions from Savoy and the Franche-Comte; but we are assured when their whole Army is formed it will not exceed thirty thousand Men. Letters from Switzerland say, that the Inhabitants of the County of Tockenbourg had again taken Arms against the Abbot of St. Gall, and had possessed themselves of the Castles of Yberg, Schwarzenbach and Leuispurg, which would probably occasion a Convention of the whole Helvetic Body.

Hanover, May 13. N. S. The Elector is at Veyhausen in the Terriory of Zell, where his Highness entertains himself with the Diversions of Horse-Racing and Hunting. His Electoral Highness is expected at Herenhausen the latter end of this Week, where he designs to pass the Summer. The Electoral Prince is gone this Morning to review a Battalion of Guards, and to see them perform their Exercise in the Neighbourhood of this City. Monsieur Fabrice, Envoy from the Administrator of Holstein to the King of Sweden, designs to set out this Evening for Vienna, from whence he will continue his Journey to Bender. Advices from Poland of the third Instant say, that the Muscovite Army is already marched into Garrison, and hath actually Invested Wybourg; that the Garrison of Riga was under such great Difficulties, that the Muscovites hoped to be Masters of that Town within three Weeks after the Dispatch of these Letters.

Falmouth, May 8. On the 6th Instant in the Evening the Expedition Packet boat, Captain Glines Commander, failed

failed for Lisbon, having on Board several Officers, and one hundred Soldiers, for the Service in Portugal.

Plimouth, May 9. Yesterday failed her Majesty's Ships the Ruby, Fowey, Pearl, Vallour, and Monk's Prize, to cruize. The same day came in the Industry Transport, with one hundred and thirteen Prisoners from Sr. Malo. This day failed the Delight and Seahorse to cruize. My Lord Dursley in the Kenr, with the Restoration, Yarmouth, Assurance, York, Monk, Medway, and Winchester, arrived this day from cruising.

Yarmouth, May 10. Yesterday came into our Road her Majesty's Ship the Plimouth, with three Ships under her Convoy from Gottenburgh, bound for the River of Thames. This day a Fleet of Light Colliers, and divers other Ships bound for Scotland, failed under Convoy of several of her Majesty's Ships.

Portsmouth, May 11. Yesterday her Majesty's Ship, the Swiftsure failed from Spithhead to the Eastward.

Deal, May 11. Her Majesty's Ship the Swallow's Prize, failed yesterday in the Afternoon towards the River, and the Hindu and Oster to the Westward. Here remain her Majesty's Ships the Dreadnought, Norwich, Tyger, Salisbury's Prize, Loo, Porlard, Adventure, and Medway's Prize. And this Morning came in hither her Majesty's Ship the Mary-Galley.
