By former Letters from the Frontiers we had an Account, that fourteen Battalions were detached from Dauphine and Savey towards Germany and he Netherlands; bur our last Advices affure us, that fixthe Nemerianos; cur our 12th Advices asture us, that fix-teen Battelions and fix Regiments of Horse are marched for Mace and Flanders, who are to be replaced by the Troops which came last Year from Spain, and have been quartered in Languedoc and Provence; and the Cavalry is to be reinforced by some Troops from Franche Comte.
The same Advices add, that the Duke of Berwick was dily expected at Grenoble, in order to visit the Posts on be Frontiers, and affemble the Troops with the utmost Experience. Last Sunday being the Anniversary for the Duke of Aost's Birth Day, all the foreign Ministers went with Venerie, to make their Compliments to their Royd Highnesses on that Occasion. The same Day a Courier mived here from the Hague, and on Monday another from Vienna. with Letters for his Royal Higheefs, the Briffs and Du ch Ministers, concerning the Differences deepding between this and the Imperial Court. The Letters which we received by the Courier from Vienna, which are of the 22d Instant, brought an Account, that Marshal Thaun was upon his Departure for Milan, where heis expected the next Week, and three British Men of War attend at Genoa to convoy him to Barcelona. Yefindsy the Count de Rocque, Lieutenant General of Foot, and Governor of Alexandria, fet out from this Place for bis Government, to regulare the Garrison there, and give other necessary Orders, that he may be at Liberty to make the Campaign.

The Marhal Thaun is expected here this Evening from Vienna, in his way to Turin, where he is to concert with his Royal Highness the necessary Dispositions for taking the Feld, and the Operations for the ensuing Year. General Sanhope arrived here on the 1st Instant; and yesterday Morning he proceeded to Genoa. Letters from thence hy, that two British Men of War had taken and brought into that Port a French Privateer called the Private of frize carrying thirry fix Pieces of Connon and one hunand one fundered and one fundered and one fundered and forty Men; and that an English Merchantman had taken four laden Corn Ships, and fold them at Maluand Cagliari. Hamburg, May 9. N. S. Letters from Warsaw of the 27th of April say, that the Republick had consented to take into their Service six thousand Horse on the same Establishment as the Army of the Crown, and three thoufand on that of Li huania, wherewith the King is to supply them on certain Conditions, stipulated between his Majesty and the State; and also nine thousand Foot, that his Majesty bath engaged to raise for the same Service. By this Means, all the Forces, according to the Regu-lation of the last General Diet, will be compleatly levied much fooner than was expected. The Army of Lithuania is ordered to join the Muscovites before Riga. Letters from Bender, of the 17th of March, bring us certain Advices of the King of Sweden's continuance in that Place. His Majefly was then preparing for his Journey, though it was uncertain which way he would take to return to his De-minions. Colonel Schewrin and Secretary Hogewall ar-

rived there on the 26th of February.

Frankfort, May 11. N. S. This Day the Imperial Troops are to begin their March towards the respective Camps appointed for them. The French Army is assembling between Haguenau and Strasburg, and a slying l'arty will encamp in the Neighbourhood of Brisa. The Enemy have detached great Bodies to reinforce the Army in Flanders; they expect to be joined by feveral Battalions from Savoy and the Franche-Comte; but we are affured when their whole Army is formed it will not exceed thirty thousand Men. Letters from Swifferland fay, that the Inhabitants of the County of Tockenbourg had again taken Arms against the Abbot of St. Gall, and had possessed themselves of the Castles of Yberg, Schwar zen-

bach and Leurispurg, which would probably occasion a Convention of the whole Helvatick Body.

Hanover, May 13. N. S. The Elector is at Veyhaufen in the Terri ory of Zell, where his Highness entertains himself with the Divertions of Horse-Racing and Hunting. His Electoral Highness is expected at Herenhausen the latter end of this Week, where he designs to pass the Summer. The Electoral Prince is gone this Morning to review a Bartalion of Guards, and to fee them perform their Exercise in the Neighbourhood of this City. Monfieur Fabrice, Envey from the Administra-tor of Holftein to the King of Sweden, defigns to fet out this Evening for Vienna, from whence he will continue his Journey to Bender. Advices from Poland of the third Instant fay, that the Muscovite Army is already marched into Finland, and hath actually Invested Wybourg; that the Garrison of Riga was under such great Difficulties, that the Muscovites hoped to be Masters of that Town within three Weeks after the Dispatch of these Lec-
