Present,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the Churchyard extension of St. Edmund King and Martyr, Mansfield Woodhouse, in the County of Nottinghamshire, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 18th day of February 1976, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853, c. 134) and of all other powers Her enabling is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard extension of St. Edmund King and Martyr, Mansfield Woodhouse, in the County of Nottinghamshire, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Churchyard extension of St. Edmund King and Martyr, Mansfield Woodhouse, Nottinghamshire) Order 1976.
