POST OFFICE ACT 1969

GENERAL LICENCE FOR MESSAGE CONVEYING COMPUTERS

Licence

1. The Post Office, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 27 of the Post Office Act 1969 hereby licenses the running of that part of a system of telecommunication of the type described below, by all persons of the class described below, in so far as such running would otherwise infringe the privilege conferred on the Post Office by Section 24(1) of the said Act, subject to the conditions and otherwise as stated below.

Types of systems licensed

2. The part of a system hereby licensed is a computer and ancillary equipment (hereinafter called "the computer") connected to Post Office plant with the written consent of the Post Office and used for conveying, from one circuit to another, on a store and forward basis, messages not containing speech.

Class of persons licensed

3. The class of persons licensed is anyone who lawfully runs the computer.

Conditions

- 4. The computer hereby licensed may be used for conveying messages:
 - (a) between a holding company and its subsidiaries, or between subsidiaries of the same holding company, or between either a holding company or a subsidiary of its and any other person, provided that in each case either the holding company or a subsidiary of its is running the computer; and
 - (b) between a person who is running the computer and any other person.
- 5. The computer may be used in conjunction with rented Post Office inland private circuits, rented international private circuits, the public Telex system, and the public telephone system.
- 6. Provided that the written consent of the Post Office is obtained before a message is conveyed by the computer between either an international private circuit and another private circuit, or an international private circuit and a public system terminal, the computer may be used:—
 - (a) To receive messages from Post Office inland private circuits for automatic conveyance to other Post Office inland private circuits, to international private circuits, to the public Telex system, and to the public telephone system.
 - (b) To receive messages from international private circuits for automatic conveyance to other international private circuits, to Post Office inland private circuits, to the public Telex system, and to the public telephone system.
 - (c) To receive messages from the public Telex system for automatic conveyance to Post Office inland private circuits, to international private circuits, to the public telephone system, and to other public Telex terminals.
 - (d) To receive messages from the public telephone system for automatic conveyance to Post Office inland private circuits, to international private circuits, to the public Telex system, and to other public telephone terminals.
- 7. Every message conveyed by the computer or by any circuit used in conjunction with it shall relate solely and exclusively to the business affairs of either the originator or the addressee of the message.
- 8. The origin and destination of every message conveyed by means of the computer or any circuit used in conjunction with it shall be given clearly and unambiguously either at the beginning or the end of the message in a language or code comprehensible to the Post Office,

and shall be separate from the text of the said message which said text shall itself be in a language or code comprehensible as aforesaid, and every such message transmitted to the public Telex system shall contain in the message header the answer back code approved by the Post Office for lines terminating on the computer.

- 9. Nothing in this Licence shall alter or amend the terms of any licence, Scheme, or agreement relating to the use of any attachment or any Post Office inland private circuit or any international private circuit or the public Telex system or the public telephone system used in connection with the computer and if observance of such terms is not possible the computer shall not be used.
- 10. Any person authorised in writing by the Post Office shall be permitted at any reasonable time to inspect the computer and any associated equipment, cables or circuits and the working and use thereof; and from time to time and after giving reasonable notice to:-
 - (a) Inspect any messages or records of messages conveyed by the computer.
 - (b) Monitor without further notice any message being conveyed by the computer or by any circuit used in connection with it.
 - (c) Send test messages via the computer.
- 11. (a) The Post Office may at any time revoke this Licence either wholly or with respect to any particular computer by publishing a notice to that effect in whatever manner appears to it to be appropriate, provided that the duration of the notice of revocation shall not exceed six months.
- (b) The Post Office may at any time revoke this Licence with respect to any particular person hereby licensed by giving him written notice (which shall not exceed six months) to that effect.

Interpretation

12. In this Licence, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them respectively, that is to say:

"holding company" and "subsidiary" shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Section 154 of the Companies Act, 1948;

"international private circuit" means a circuit other than a circuit forming part of a public system, provided partly by the Post Office and partly by one or more telecommunication administrations or recognised private operating agencies other than the Post Office, which connects a point within the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man with a point outside the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands or the Irish Republic; "person" shall include any body of persons, cor-

porate or unincorporate;
"Post Office inland private circuit" means a Post Office provided circuit other than a circuit forming part of a public system which connects a point within the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man with a point within the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands or the Irish Republic;

'recognised private operating agency" means a company or corporation which runs an international public telecommunications service under the authority of the telecommunications administration in whose territory the

applicable part of that service is provided.

Citation

13. This licence may be cited as the Post Office General Licence 1976 (1).

a valid permit within the space thereon appropriate to the date on which the vehicle is left in the parking place and the calendar combined with the valid permit must be displayed on the vehicle. If the valid permit must be displayed on the vehicle. If the vehicle displays a valid permit combined with a valid season ticket no such charge is payable. The charge for season tickets will be £2.75, £7.50 or £26 for tickets expiring at the end of 1 month, 3 months or 12 months respectively, running from the beginning of the month in which they are issued, except in the case of season tickets which become valid on 28th June 1976 where no additional charge will be payable in respect of the three days prior to 1st July 1976;

(iv) in respect of metered parking places, the excess charge—payable to the Borough Council—will be £3; the excess period will be 1 hour; the unexpired time shown on the parking meter may be used free of charge and the period during which a vehicle may not return to a parking place will be 1 hour;

(g) provides that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

(g) any vehicle which enters the bus lane for the sole purpose of waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes to enable a person suffering from any disability or injury (including blindness) which seriously impairs his ability to walk to board or alight from

that vehicle;

(h) any vehicle which enters or proceeds in the bus lane:

(i) in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 6 to this notice will be extended so that such prohibition will apply between 7 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive.

(ii) from any vehicular accessway or carriage crossing over the footway adjoining the bus lane if that vehicle forthwith leaves the bus lane at a point opposite that vehicular accessway or carriage crossing;
