

(d) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle in lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3 to this notice will be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Islington Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(e) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3 to this notice will be prohibited.

3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2 (c) (a) above will not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" will apply.

4. The prohibitions and requirement referred to in paragraph 2 (A) and (B) above will not apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

5. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 7th June 1976 of the Islington (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have amended that Order) and of the Council's statement of reasons for making the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive during the period of 12 months from that date in Room B.21, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.

6. Copies of the Order may be purchased from the Information Centre, Greater London Council, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB.

7. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of an provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the ground that any requirement of that section of the Act or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

8. If the provisions of the Order continue in operation for a period of not less than 12 months and have not at any time been varied under section 9 of the Act of 1967, the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1967. Any person desiring to object to the making of the Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1967 for the purposes of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the afore-mentioned period of 12 months, send a statement in writing of his objection and the grounds thereof to the Director of Planning and Transportation, The County Hall, London, SE1 7PB, quoting the reference PT/TD/0.

Doctor Parking Places in Highgate Avenue and Osborne Road

Notice is hereby given that, on the application of the Council of the London Borough of Haringey, the Greater London Council on 17th May 1976, made the Haringey (Doctor Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1976 under sections 35, 36, 37 and 40 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968.

2. The effect of the Order will be to:

- (a) designate parking places on the highways specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice;
- (b) provide that vehicles displaying a permit issued under the Order may be left in the parking places;
- (c) provide that the parking places will be in operation between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on any day of the week;
- (d) provide that a permit may be issued by the Haringey Borough Council on application being made by legally qualified medical practitioners;

NOTE. Permits in respect of a parking place in a highway specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice will be issued only in connection with the medical practice conducted at the premises specified in relation thereto in column 2 of the Schedule; and

- (e) provide that the charge in connection with the issue of permits will be £45 in respect of each parking place or, if a parking place contains more than one parking bay, in respect of each such parking bay and that the permits will be valid for a period of 12 months.

3. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation for the purposes of the applications for permits and for the placing of traffic signs, etc., on 1st June 1976, and for all other purposes on 7th June 1976, and of the map indicating each length of road to which the Order relates can be inspected until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Order was made during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in Room B.21, The County Hall, London S.E.1.
