And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any eight or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any eight or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

The Director General of Fair Trading, in exercise of his powers under sections 10 (3) and (4), 47 (1) and (2), 49 (1) and 50 (1) of the Fair Trading Act 1973 hereby refers to the Monopolies and Mergers Commission the matter of the existence or the possible existence of a monopoly situation in solution to the small property of the sample tion in relation to the supply of petrol in the United Kingdom by wholesale.

The Commission shall investigate and report on the questions whether a monopoly situation exists by virtue of section 6 (1) (c) of the said Act in relation to such supply and, if so:

(a) in favour of what persons that monopoly situation

(b) whether any steps (by way of uncompetitive practices or otherwise) are being taken by those persons for the purpose of exploiting or maintaining the monopoly situation and, if so, by what uncompetitive practices

or in what other way;
(c) whether any action or omission on the part of those persons is attributable to the existence of the monopoly

situation and, if so, what action or omission and in what way it is so attributable; and (d) whether any facts found by the Commission in pursuance of their investigations operate, or may expected to operate, against the public interest.

The Commission shall, in investigating and reporting upon this reference, limit consideration to the three following practices, namely:

(i) discriminating between retailers in relation to the

In this reference "proprietary interests" does not include an interest by way of security for indebtedness; and "discriminating" does not include the refusal of credit on ordinary commercial considerations.

The Commission shall report upon this reference within period of two years from the date hereof.
