By virtue of the Act, no buildings in a Conservation Area may be demolished either completely or in part unless the prior consent of the local planning authority has been obtained. There are penalties for demolishing buildings

without first obtaining consent.

Before work is carried out affecting any tree in a Conservation Area, 6 weeks notice in writing must be given to the local planning authority, stating the work proposed, together with sufficient particulars to identify the tree(s) concerned. It is an offence under the Act to cut down, top, lop, uproot or wilfully damage or destroy any such tree without consent.

There are certain exceptions to each of the above requirements, and any person contemplating such action should contact the Daventry District Council for advice.

A plan showing the extent of the Conservation Area may be inspected at the District Planning Department, District Council Offices, St. John's Square, Daventry, during normal office hours.
