DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Various Streets, South Brent) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that on the 19th July 1976, the Devon County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) and section 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.

When the Order comes into effect on the 30th day of July 1976, you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle:

- (1) at any time in specified lengths of Totnes Road, Plymouth Road, Fore Street, Church Street and Station Road;
- (2) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily in specified lengths of Chapel Fields and Totnes Road;
- (3) for a longer period than one hour, no return within one hour, between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, in specified lengths of Fore Street, Church Street and Station Road.

Exceptions in the Order permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) collecting or delivering postal packets for the Post Office;
- (d) taking in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage and where necessary in connection with
- (e) the maintenance of the road;
- (f) the supply of gas, electricity and water, and
- (g) the services of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Subject to compliance with the requirements of the appropriate regulations, provision is made in the Order allowing disabled persons' vehicles (i) to wait for a maximum period of two hours (no return within one hour) in the lengths of road mentioned in (1) and (2) above; and (ii) to wait in the lengths of road mentioned in (3) above.

A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the lengths of road affected, may be inspected during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the offices of the South Hams District Council, Follaton House, Plymouth Road, Totnes, or at the address given below.

If you wish to question the validity of this Order or any provision made under it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the relevant section of the Act or that any requirement of the Act of any regulation made under it has not been complied with, you may, within 6 weeks of the date of this Order, apply to the High Court for that purpose.

GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The Greater Manchester County (Newgate, Rochdale) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (County) Order, 1975.

Notice is hereby given that on the 27th July 1976, the Greater Manchester County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is:

- (a) To prohibit waiting at all times on:

Newgate, south side from St. Mary's Gate for 209 metres in an easterly direction to a point 19 metres from the junction of The Butts/Esplanade.

Newgate, north side from St. Mary's Gate for 150 metres in an easterly direction to the shopping development service road.

The service road south of Newgate from Newgate to St. Mary's Gate, both sides.

The left filter lane from St. Mary's Gate to Newgate, both sides.

The south side of the access road connection from the service road south of Newgate westwards to the Police Complex entrance.

The north side of the access road connection from the Police Complex entrance to the parking bay.

- (b) To prohibit waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays on:

Newgate, north side from the shopping development service road for 53 metres in an easterly direction to a point 19 metres from The Butts/Esplanade.

- (c) To limit waiting to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour, on Mondays to Saturdays in the parking bay on the north side of the access road connection from the service road south of Newgate.

The Order which comes into operation on the 16th August 1976, contains exemptions to permit waiting for the purposes of boarding or alighting, loading or unloading, building operations or work on or under any of the lengths of road. The statutory exemption for disabled persons vehicles is included in the Order.
