Notice is hereby given that Cheltenham Borough Council in accordance with arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, with Gloucestershire County Council, the highway authority, and in pursuance of the powers of the said County Council under section 1 (1), (2), (3), (3AA) and (6) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967") and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 84C (1) of the Act of 1967, propose to make an Order the effect of which will be:

1. To prevent any person from causing or permitting any commercial vehicle which has an unladen weight exceeding 3 tons from entering or proceeding in that length of Arle Avenue in the Borough which extends from its junction with Arle Road in a north-easterly direction to a point level with the boundary between Nos. 47 and 49 Arle Avenue.

2. The Order will include exemptions:

(a) for the conveyance of goods to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to that length of Arle Avenue ;

(b) in connection with the carrying out or in premises situated on or adjacent to, that length of road of any of the following operations:

(i) building, industrial or demolition operations;

(ii) the removal of obstruction to traffic; and (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road;

(c) for or in connection with the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to that length of Arle Avenue of any sewer or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas or electricity or any telegraphic line;

(d) for fire brigade, police or ambulance services;
(e) for vehicles in the service of a local authority
or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers

or duties; or

(f) for or in connection with the conveyance of goods for sale from the vehicle.
