CARADON DISTRICT COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY AMENITIES ACT 1974
St. Germans Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Caradon District Council in pursuance of its powers under section 277 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, has designated part of the village of St. Germans as a Conservation Area.

The Conservation Area includes all of the built up area of St. Germans village except for the Fairfield Housing Estate and more recent housing development at Cuddenbeak. The area extends northwards to Lithiok and Barn Meadow Plantation, westwards to the western end of Coldgear Plantation, eastwards to the River Tiddy, and southwards to Quay Road including some of the dwellings on the southern side of the road and the quays.

A plan showing the Conservation Area referred to above may be inspected during normal office hours from Monday to Friday inclusive at:

- (i) The Council Offices, Church House, Saltash;
- (ii) The Planning and Development Department, 1 West Street, Liskeard.

The effect of the designation, since the introduction of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1974, is summarised as follows:

- (1) Anyone wishing to demolish a building within a Conservation Area must first apply for Listed Building Consent to the Local Planning Authority (certain buildings being excluded).
- (2) Anyone wishing to cut down, lop, top, uproot or damage any tree within a Conservation Area must give the Local District Council 6 weeks notice of his/her intention.
- (3) Anyone failing to maintain in a proper state of repair any unoccupied Listed Building, or in certain circumstances an unoccupied unlisted building is liable for any costs incurred by the Local Planning Authority in carrying out urgent repairs under the terms of section 101 of the 1971 Act.

EDEN DISTRICT COUNCIL NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—SECTION 210
Eden District Council (Brougham) Public Path Diversion Order, 1976

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 3rd August 1976, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Eden District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to vary the line of the public footpath numbered 11 on the Definitive Map by creating a new length of public footpath from the gateway at which the existing footpath crosses the southern boundary of O.S. Plot 8227 thence running on the northern side of the boundary fence in an east-south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 43 yards thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 66 yards thence in a northerly direction on the western side of the boundary fence for a distance of approximately 75 yards to rejoin

the existing footpath and by creating a new length of public footpath from the junction of the existing footpath and the Class II county road B.6262, thence along the western and southern radius of the estate road for a distance of approximately 60 yards to rejoin the existing public footpath.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Town Hall, Penrith, and may be inspected there, free of charge, any weekday between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 4.45 p.m.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Solicitor, Eden District Council, Town Hall, Penrith, not later than 5th September 1976, and should state the grounds on which it is made. If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the Eden District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
