

any pedal-bicycle or tricycle proceeding in those lengths of road and footpath specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 hereunder to enter the roads and footpaths specified in Column 2.

The restrictions imposed in (a) above shall not apply to:

- (a) emergency service vehicles;
- (b) vehicles used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (c) post office vehicles used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets;
- (d) vehicles engaged in street works and street cleansing;
- (e) vehicles engaged in building or demolition works;
- (f) vehicles engaged in removing obstructions;
- (g) stage carriages;
- (h) invalid carriages (i.e. a mechanically propelled vehicle not exceeding 5 cwt. unladen weight specially designed and constructed for the use of a person suffering from some physical defect or disability and used solely by such a person);
- (i) any goods vehicle requiring access to premises situated in the roads referred to in Column 2 of Schedule 1 hereunder between the hours of 4 p.m. and 11 a.m.
- (j) vehicles used in connection with any wedding or funeral held at any of the churches in South Street, where two clear working days written notice has been given to the County Surveyor;
- (k) vehicles requiring access to Nos. 41, 41 (a) and 41 (c) South Street (i.e. premises whose sole access is from New Street).

The alternative route necessitated by the restrictions denying access is as follows:

from the junction of South Street with High West Street and High East Street (A35) westwards along High West Street to the roundabout at the Top O' Town; then southwards along Albert Road and Cornwall Road to the traffic lights at the junction with Great Western Road and finally eastwards along Great Western Road to the Junction; and reverse.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the date hereunder, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The County of Durham (Roman Avenue, Chester-le-Street) (Experimental Prohibition of Waiting) Order

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council propose to make an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day on the north side of Roman Avenue from its junction with Lindisfarne Avenue to its junction with Park Road Central at Chester-le-Street in Chester-le-Street District for an experimental period.

There will be exemptions in the Order in respect of boarding or alighting; loading or unloading of goods; building operations and demolitions; removal of obstructions to traffic; maintenance of the road; Post Office vehicles; fire brigade, police or ambulance vehicles; statutory powers and disabled persons.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The County of Durham (New Elvet, City of Durham) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Durham propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.

The effect of the Order will be:

- (1) to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in any of the sides or lengths of New Elvet in the City of Durham, specified in Schedule 1 below;
- (2) to limit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the sides or lengths of New Elvet in the City of Durham, specified in Schedule 2 below, to 30 minutes in any one hour;
- (3) to revoke the Orders or parts of Orders specified in Schedule 3 below.

There will be exemptions in the Order in respect of boarding or alighting; loading or unloading of goods; building operations and demolitions; removal of obstructions to traffic; maintenance of the road; Post Office vehicles; fire brigade, police or ambulance vehicles; statutory powers and disabled persons.
