NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1959 COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Hebden Royd Footpath No. 47) Public Path Diversion Order 1976.

Notice is hereby given that on 3rd August 1976 the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from a point on Park Lane, Mytholmroyd in the District of Calderdale east of 1 Little Park Farm at 00272586 in a north-north-easterly direction for approximately 28 yards, to 00272588 being part of the Path number 47 in the former Urban District of Hebden Royd to a line running from a point on Park Lane, east of 1 Little Park Farm aforesaid at 00282586 in an easterly direction for approximately 8 yards and in a northerly direction for approximately 27 yards to 00272588.

The Order becomes operative as from 13th August 1976 but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 13th August 1976 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

MISCELLANEOUS PUBLIC NOTICES

LONDON BOROUGH OF REDBRIDGE

CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the London Borough of Redbridge, acting by the Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 63 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 on the 27th day of May 1976 made an Order entitled *The Chadwell Heath No. 1 Noise Abatement Order 1976* declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a noise abatement zone which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the Order and by virtue of sections 63, 64, 65, 66 and 67 of the Act, if noise emitted from any premises constitutes a contravention of subsection (1) of section 65 or of a condition attached to a consent under this section, the person responsible shall be guilty of an offence against this part of this Act and liable on summary conviction to a fine of £200 in the case of a first offence and £400 in the case of a second or subsequent offence against this part of this Act.

Section 65 subsection (1) states the level of noise recorded in the noise level register in respect of any premises shall not be exceeded except with the consent in writing of the local authority.

Section 66 subsection (8) states a person who without reasonable excuse contravenes a noise reduction notice shall be guilty of an offence against this part of this Act.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, High Road, Ilford, Essex, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 19th August 1976.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, SW1P 2EB, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The Chadwell Heath No. 1 Noise Abatement Order 1976

Commence at the junction of the High Road and Barley Lane, Ilford. Proceed north along the centre of Barley Lane to its junction with Eastern Avenue, then proceed east along the centre of Eastern Avenue to the borough boundary, then south following the borough boundary to the High Road, then west along the centre of the High Road to its junction with Barley Lane, Ilford.

Within the area premises identified by the London Borough of Redbridge as being premises to which this Order will relate when brought into operation are:

- (i) Industrial premises—factories as defined by the Factories Act 1961, Section 175—small workshops.
- (ii) Commercial premises—warehouses, cold stores.
- (iii) Places of public entertainment or assembly—theatres, bingo halls, discotheques, stadia.
- (iv) Transport installations—container bases.
- (v) Public utility installations—transformer sub-stations.
